ourism and Sports Minister Phiphat Ratchakitprakarn in Phuket last Sunday (Sept 6) plainly told business operators and residents in the tourism town that the launch of the 'Phuket Model' for allowing long-stay tourists to arrive

The announcement followed Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Governor Yuthasak Supasorn just days earlier revealing that he believed the launch of the 'Phuket Model' efforts to revive the local economy,

in Phuket on Oct 1 was "not likely".

was likely to be pushed back.

Under the Phuket Model, presented by the Ministry of Tourism and Sports, about 200 visitors from Australia and New Zealand were to be allowed in. However, they must first test negative for the virus in their country of origin and stay in quarantine for 14 days at designated places in Phuket. After that, the visitors can travel throughout the province if they test negative for COVID-19. But if they want to visit other provinces, they will have to stay in quarantine in their respective provinces for another seven days.

However, the government's plan to scheduled for next month as part of reopen Phuket as a model to welcome back foreign visitors gained resistance after the country last week saw the first case of local COVID-19 infection in more than three months.

The announcement by Minister Phiphat last Sunday capped off a weekend that saw himself and no less than three deputy ministers and their entourages as well as Member of Parliament representatives from the Bhumjaithai Party visit various communities across Phuket to "gain feedback" from local residents and business owners about the 'Phuket Model' for allowing long-stay tourists to arrive in Phuket.

It also followed Deputy Prime Minister and Public Health Minister Anutin Charnvirakul in Phuket last Saturday (Sept 5) calling for local residents and business owners to be confident as the province aims to navigate and overcome the challenges posed by the global COVID-19 pandemic.

Tourism Minister Phiphat last Sunday said that his office had been dispatched by Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha to gather feedback from local residents and business owners and about the 'Phuket Model'. About 100 people were present at the public meeting in Patong, including Patong businessman Preechavude "Prab" Keesin, Patong Entertainment Business Association (PEBA) President Weerawit Kreuasombat and Patong Mayor Chalermluck Kebsup...

COVID fears hold tourism at bay

A delegation from the Ministry of Tourism and Sports had arrived in Phuket and conducted activities last Saturday and Sunday to gain feedback from Phuket people about the proposed 'Phuket Model', Mr Phiphat said.

"Next, we will draft a summary of this information and report it to the Prime Minister," he added.

Mr Phiphat explained that he had spoken with local residents and business operators in Phuket Town and Patong "to determine the needs of each".

"I believe we have obtained good information. Please feel comfortable, and wait for more announcements in the near future," he said.

"The Prime Minister will personally answer to the public about the solution for the Phuket Model. This is not only a tourism issue, the result will solve other issues because many officials from many

other ministries have come to Phuket to observe the situation [here]," he added.

Mr Phiphat said a concern was poor communication of the tourism issues "that may not be 100% complete", which he said would likely delay the launch of the Phuket Model to allow tourists to return, even with precautionary measures to prevent an outbreak of COVID-19 on the island.

"I believe that the Phuket Model is likely to not start on Oct 1, mainly due to fear among Phuket people," he said.

Mr Phiphat also said that he recognised that "about 90% of the income generated in the province is from tourism".

"This time, it comes down to communicating through various channels of Phuket the right way, to let the people of Phuket know what to do in order to bring tourists from abroad to Phuket in the future," he added.

Mr Phiphat repeated that

all tourists who will eventually be allowed to come to Phuket must first be tested in their home country before coming to Thailand, and they will be tested again after they arrive. They will all also be required to serve a mandatory 14-day quarantine period in an Alternative Local State Quarantine (ALSQ) venue, he said.

All protocols to be implemented to prevent COVID-19 from being brought to Phuket by a visiting tourist must first be approved by the Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA), Mr Phiphat assured.

The failure to relaunch international tourism, and the failure of the domestic tourism campaigns to support businesses in Phuket, spurred an outcry from the Phuket Hotels Association, which on Monday said Phuket's hotel industry is

reaching breaking point and drastic economic support from the government is needed for it to survive the high season.


New research by consulting group C9 Hotelworks points to COVID-19's crippling implications with airport arrivals plunging, the Phuket Model stuttering and 50,000 jobs expected to be lost if there are no overseas visitors this year, the release said.

"What is clear is that the 86,000 rooms in Phuket's registered accommodation establishments cannot realistically break-even or even be cash-flow positive with only domestic demand. This realistically could set the scene for 50,000 job losses in the hotel sector this year if there's no support forthcoming or international visitors are not allowed in.

Anthony Lark, President of the Phuket Hotels Association, which represents 78 hotels in Phuket said, "The

math simply doesn't work with single-digit occupancies being reported. No amount of induced local demand can prevent the dramatic continued loss of jobs and rapidly eroding financial crisis for owners and operators. We strongly advocate a safe, pragmatic, and strategic reopening for foreign travelers."

C9 Hotelworks Managing Director Bill Barnett said, "Thailand's failure to relaunch overseas tourism creates a dangerously perilous scenario for Phuket's hospitality industry. The domino financial impact is not only on hotels and the expanded tourism sector, but it suffocates the development pipeline. This will negatively trigger the erosion of jobs in construction, real estate, retail and ultimately be manifested in consumer credit defaults. The situation is bad, and likely to get worse, as operating hotels continue to incur losses day in and day out."







Struggling to attract tourists

ourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Phuket Office Director Napasorn Kakai has revealed that some 15,000 tourists came to Phuket to enjoy the four-day long weekend from Sept 4-7, altogether spending an estimated B80 million over the holidays.

Ms Napasorn said that the 125 hotels on the island currently open, providing some 8,000 rooms for guests, had recorded an overall occupancy rate of around 30%.

Of the 15,000 tourists who came to Phuket, 98% were Thai and 2% were foreigners, she said.

The average expenditure per person, including travel costs, was estimated at around B5,500 per person per day, Ms Napasorn said, noting that altogether the tourists travelling to Phuket over the long weekend had generated some B80mn for the economy.

Ms Napasorn pointed out that there are currently 34 flights traveling to Phuket every day, comprising 30 flights from Bangkok as well as flights from other major destinations in Thailand such as Chiang Rai, Chiang Mai, Koh Samui and Udon Thani.

Most of the flights were enjoying around 80% occupancy, bringing some 5,000 passengers per day to Phuket, she added.

of the long weekend in attracting tourists to Phuket as low, but added that it was expected.

"When comparing the actual number of tourists who came to Phuket with the number of tourists expected to come, there is no difference. Some tourists went north to Khao Lak in Phang Nga, as a lot of five-star hotels there have given big discounts, which can be even cheaper with the discounts offered

Ms Napasorn rated the success through the We Travel Together which are currently quite expensive, campaign," she said.

> "The reason we have not had large numbers of tourists might be because of the image that visiting Phuket is expensive, even though we have been trying to create a new good image," Ms Napasorn said.

> "When comparing the cost of a holiday in Phuket, it is much cheaper [for people in Bangkok] to travel to a province nearby. They do not have to spend money on flight tickets,

or take a long time to drive to their destination," she added.

Of note, popular tourist destinations within driving distance of Bangkok have reported spikes in tourist numbers over the long weekend.

To help boost travel to Phuket tourists. early in the month, the TAT Phuket office offered any person from outside Phuket who booked at least one guest accommodation room in

Phuket for at least one night anytime from Sept 2-9 a B500 voucher to be spent at local restaurants or other local businesses that took part in the campaign. To claim the voucher, tourists only needed to present to TAT Phuket officers evidence of their room booking, Ms Napasorn

The TAT Phuket office this month also will hold a domestic tourism roadshow to other provinces in southern Thailand, including Nakhon Sri Thammarat and Hat Yai in Songkhla, and stage a domestic tourism event in Bangkok on Sept 11-13 to present tour packages to expats working in Bangkok, Ms Napasorn said.

"TAT Phuket is also working with the travel Facebook page 'Sneak out หนีเที่ยว', which has more than 2 million followers, to create content about Phuket tourist attractions and feature budget travel options like B4,000 for a three-day trip,"

Meanwhile, the TAT Phuket campaign "Phuket Great Time" continues, providing a free online booking platform for all tourismrelated businesses in Phuket to offer discount packages to prospective

"We hope that all campaigns we have conducted will stimulate the economy and attract more Thais to Phuket," Ms Napasorn said.

TAT vows to end dual pricing

EXPATRIATES MAY NOT be able to join tourism stimulus packages, but the government pledges to end dual pricing as soon as possible.

Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Governor Yuthasak Supasorn said the We Travel Together stimulus campaign is funded by a budget issued under the Loan Act, which has terms that make it hard to include foreigners, reported the *Bangkok Post*.

But the TAT will discuss stopping dual pricing for expatriates with the National Parks,

Mr Yuthasak said the move will let expats save money, allowing them to spend more as a key target to boost domestic

The agency wants to in-

verify expats' status, helping to distinguish them from tourists so they will be charged the same price as locals.

The expat travel card would be issued by the TAT. The agency hopes to sign a memorandum of understanding with each department that owns tourist attractions to fix a standard local price for card holders permanently, not just during the pandemic.

Businesses in Phuket are gearing up to receive tourists amid 'Travel Bubble' discussions

To redress the financial impacts of COVID-19, the Thai Government has been in talks with a handful of low-risk countries around the world over setting up 'travel bubbles' to rebuild its economy, which would allow passengers from those select countries to travel to Phuket and other parts of Thailand as tourists.

While the local government has not made any official announcements on when the 'travel bubble' agreements will be in effect, many businesses in Phuket, an island whose economy is heavily reliant on tourism, are gearing up to welcome tourists.

Villagers protest new 'unnecessary' shipyard

ome 200 people from Phuket's fishing industry gathered at a public meeting last Thursday (Sept 3) to protest the government's support for a new shipyard to be built on government land on Koh Siray.


Marsan Public Company Limited held the public hearing to gain feedback on the project, which will see a new shipyard and boat repair yard built on 66 rai near Phuket Fishing Pier belonging to the Phuket Fishing Pier Fisheries Organization.

Marsan has been selected to develop the project.

Led by Somyot Wongboonyakul, President of the Phuket Fishermen's Association, the 200-strong group of protesters held banners denouncing the project, accusing it of being conducted only for personal gain and claiming that Phuket's fishing fleet did not need another shipyard.

The group urged the government to stop supporting the project, and asked for the shipyard to be built elsewhere.

Phatthawin Chongwisarn, Chief Executive Officer of Marson Public Company Limited, explained that the shipyard was to support the building and repair of fishing boats, cruise ships and yachts from the tourism industry.



more vessels built and repaired in Phuket, instead of going outside the country to have shipworks completed abroad.

"In the past, our company has developed quality systems and certified standards in all aspects. Therefore, in developing a part of the area at the Phuket Fishing Port to become a shipyard and ship repair facility, we can be confident that we will be able to manage the project efficiently and provide quality work, and not affect the environment, and uphold the necessary occupational health and safety standards," he said.

"The company has assigned Innovation Consultant Co Ltd to prepare a report on the study of measures to prevent and correct the impact on the quality of life of local residents, protect

The aim of the project was to have the environment and uphold the safety of the project required in order to apply for a factory business license. If the villagers still do not agree, this will be further reviewed," he said.

> The project was one of the complaints presented to MP Rangsiman Rome, who is spokesman of the House of Law, Justice and Human Rights committee, during his visit to Phuket last month.

> Also of note is that the project is to be built in Moo 1 Rassada, where local villagers have already held a protest calling for an investigation into allegations of corruption against village chief Maitri Duangchan.

> "For 10 years as the village head, he has never held any public hearings about anything that affects us," villager Suthon Pontha said during the protest last month.

Nai Harn faces dog ban

RAWAI MAYOR AROON Solos will ban people from walking their dogs along Nai Harn Beach, enforced by a fine of up to B2,000 for whoever violates the ban.

The move follows a report that one visitor to the beach was set upon by two dogs that another visitor had brought to the beach, but allowed the dogs to roam free.

"We will post signs to explain that dogs are not allowed to be brought onto the beach. They will not be allowed on the sand, but they will be allowed on the grass area near the beach from 7am to 7pm every day," Mayor Aroon told The Phuket News.

"The sign will also show that whoever violates the rule will be fined up to B2,000," he added.

Rawai Municipality officials would further discuss the rule and the fine later, Mayor Aroon added.

Mayor Aroon added that the number of stray dogs at the beach was also a concern.

However, he added that he had never received a report that anyone at the beach had been attacked by the stray dogs there.

"I have been informed that many stray dogs are in the area, and some of these dogs

have scared some visitors at the beach, but I have not heard of anyone being bitten or attacked by these dogs. I think they are not aggressive and have not tried to bite anyone,"

"If a dog does attack any visitor, I will send officers there to have the dog removed," he added.

Mayor Aroon noted that many of the stray dogs at the beach tend to be well cared for.

"Some people take food to give to them at the beach, while others give them food at the temple [nearby]. The dogs do not get food from trash at the beach, as the trash is cleared from Nai Harn beach every day," he said.

THE CULINARY DETECTIVE

ollowing the easing of domestic travel restrictions, I am now back to my regular schedule of monthly trips to Phuket. I truly enjoy these short jaunts, discovering hidden gems, both new and old, near my residence in the quaint village of Rawai.

Despite the implications of the recent crisis, sadly still with us, I have been particularly struck by how this coastal suburb continues to grow, attracting a number of burgeoning new restaurants, yet still maintains its wonderfully rustic foundation. Rawai has always been a popular destination for foreigners seeking to settle, slightly more price friendly than the more exclusive west coast and still far enough away from the booming nightlife of Patong. My only sadness is that I am only able to visit for a week or so every month.

On my visits, I almost always have a tight schedule with little opportunity for flexibility. I must confess that I have driven past today's venue for lunch many times on the winding road to Nai Harn beach and whilst it has been on my list to visit, I had never managed to squeeze it in. That is until now.

Fortuitously, Olivier, the proprietor of Shakers, reached out to me and I now find myself heading there for a long overdue lunch. I am warmly welcomed by Olivier himself, a Belgian national and long-term resident of the island. Shakers has actually been around in Phuket since 2003 when it opened its doors in Patong. After establishing a loyal following, relocated to its present site in 2014. The name, perhaps a nod, to Olivier's former skill as a specialty barman; he previously won many awards including the highly prized, golden shaker.

Seated on the terrace, I am pleasantly surprised, particularly in the current climate, to find the restaurant fairly well occupied despite the time of day and encouraged to overhear several of Olivier's compatriots, ordering without even looking at menus, indicating their regular patronage.

My partner and I choose a number of dishes from the truly lengthy menu which covers both Thai stalwarts and Western favourites, including meatballs in tomato sauce, chicken schnitzel, pizzas and pasta. There are also a number of daily specials scribed on a wall mounted blackboard indicating the offering, dependent on the day; all you can eat BBQ, ribs and unsurprisingly, mussels and fries. Of course, Sundays feature roast meats served with all the trimmings. If you can't find something to satisfy your appetite on this menu, I really don't know where else you would go!



I survey the surroundings, which whilst simply furnished, are cosy, the terrace bright and airy, the restaurant slightly more formal. Pool, darts and live sport are evidently popular. My partner has chosen from the Thai dishes on offer, a Tom Yam Kung and a Spaghetti Khee Mao with prawns. I have selected a Patong pizza and a burger; we share all. The Tom Yum, spicy with juicy prawns, the noodles equally tasty. My burger hits the spot, tender and perfectly cooked; the pizza, a thin and crispy achievement with onions, salami. cheese, and tomato.

To end, the dessert menu does not disappoint, continuing the trend of offering many choices. Whilst tempted by Belgian waffles, I fear I will be unable to do them justice, so choose a crème brulee. It is lusciously creamy with a crunchy topping. I thank Olivier for his hospitality and as I depart, I reflect. When I do finally relocate to Phuket



full time, I will certainly be returning to Shakers, perhaps even becoming one of those regulars!



Pierre steps on the gas in Italian thriller

ierre Gasly is the first Frenchman to win a Formula 1 race in 24 years after claiming his maiden victory in a thriller at the Italian Grand Prix last Sunday (Sept 6).

The 24-year-old Alpha-Tauri driver beat McLaren's Carlos Sainz and Racing Point's Lance Stroll to the flag after inheriting the lead from poleman Lewis Hamilton, who served a stop-go penalty for a tyre change while pit lane was closed.

But Hamilton wasn't the only frontrunner to hit trouble. with a slew of problems creating a perfect storm to deliver the unpredictable podium.

Mercedes teammate Valtteri Bottas failed to make any ground on his championship deficit, clawing back only a single point from fifth place after a shocking start dropped him from second to sixth on the first lap.

Red Bull Racing's Max Verstappen withdrew from the race with a power unit problem and his teammate, Thai driver Alex Albon, languished near the back of the field with damage from the first lap.

Neither Ferrari finished the race, with a brake failure putting Sebastian Vettel into retirement and Charles Leclerc

crashing out of the race in a high-speed shunt at Parabolica.

That crash defined the day, requiring a suspension to repair the barriers and dividing the race into two distinct parts.

Gasly had been mired near the back of the back early in the race, but a welltimed safety car before the red flag catapulted him up to third on the restart grid. With all the frontrunning drivers bar Hamilton out of action and the Briton due to serve his penalty, he was the defacto leader when the race resumed from a standing start

He scythed past Stroll, who restarted from second but

was suffering on cold tyres, to build a lead, but further back McLaren's Carlos Sainz had designs on the top step of the podium.

Sainz moved into second place on lap 35, but with the best of his tyres worn it took him another 17 laps, the penultimate tour of the grand prix, to close to within a second of the leading car.

But Gasly, having been managing his pace, had time to consider his defence. He was flawless out of the chicanes to ensure Sainz could slipstream him down the straights to beat him to the chequered flag by less than half a second.

It was AlphaTauri's second

win – the first coming at the hands of Sebastian Vettel at the same circuit in 2008 when the team was named Toro Rosso - and Gasly paid credit to the Italian squad.

Stroll took his first podium finish since 2017, Lando Norris finished fourth ahead of Bottas, with Renault's Daniel Ricciardo close behind in sixth.

Hamilton recovered impressively from 30 seconds behind the field after his stopgo penalty on lap 28 to finish seventh with a bonus point for fastest lap.

Esteban Ocon finished eighth for Renault ahead of Daniil Kvyat's AlphaTaui and Racing Point's Sergio Perez rounding out the top 10.



Tokyo Olympics to go ahead 'with or without COVID-19'

TOKYO'S POSTPONED Olympics will go ahead next year regardless of the coronavirus pandemic, IOC vice president John Coates said on Monday (Sept 7), saying they would be the "Games that conquered COVID".

The Olympics have never been cancelled outside of the world wars and Coates was adamant that the Tokyo Games will start on their revised date.

"It will take place with or without COVID. The Games will start on July 23 next year," said Coates, who heads the International Olympic Committee's Coordination Commission for the Tokyo Games.

"The Games were going to be, their theme, the Reconstruction Games after the devastation of the tsunami," he added, referring to a catastrophic earthquake and tsunami in

northeastern Japan in 2011.

"Now very much these will be the Games that conquered COVID, the light at the end of the tunnel.

"Before COVID, (IOC president) Thomas Bach said this is the best prepared Games we've ever seen," Coates added.

In an historic decision, the 2020 Olympics were postponed because of the global march of the pandemic and they are now set to open on July 23, 2021.

But Japan's borders are still largely closed to foreign visitors and a vaccine is months or even years away, feeding speculation about whether the Games are feasible at all.

Japanese officials have made clear they would not delay the Games a second time beyond 2021.

A recent poll found just one in four people in Japan want them to go ahead next year, with most backing either another postponement or a cancellation. AFP

The always entertaining, often controversial Jose Mourinho show will continue to roll at Tottenham. A lot will rest on Harry Kane and a top six finish looks to be their maximum aim.

Leicester City and Wolves will look to emulate or better their stellar showings last term, Sheffield United will be aiming to avoid the dreaded "second-season syndrome". James Rodriguez has landed at Everton and much is expected from Carlo Ancelotti's troops.

All eyes will be on newly promoted Leeds United, back after a 16-year absence under the watchful gaze of the mercurial Marcelo 'El Loco' Bielsa.

Expect fellow newbies Fulham and West Brom to struggle, likewise Aston Villa who avoided relegation by the skin of their teeth and have yet to reinforce for this campaign.
