OFFICIALS TAKE THE PLEDGE AS PHUKET NAMED LEAST CORRUPT PROVINCE IN THE COUNTRY

Phuket has been named the least corrupt province in the country in a national annual assessment of government agencies by the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC).

Suksan Prasara-ae, Director of the NACC office in Phuket, presented a plaque commemorating the accolade to Phuket Vice Governor Piyawong Choowong at a meeting held at Phuket Provincial Hall on Dec 9, marking International Anti-Corruption Day.

In total, Phuket's provincial assessment score was 94.06 points. "Which is the highest average score in the country," Mr Suksan explained at the meeting.

In this year's assessment, Phuket pipped Nakhon Sawan to the top spot. Lopburi ranked third. Phang Nga ranked ninth. Krabi did not make the top 15.

Last year, Phuket ranked 25th in the national assessment, Mr Suksan noted.

News that Phuket is the least corrupt province in the country was met with much scepticism online. Thailand

currently ranks 104th of 179 countries in the Corruption Perceptions Index by Transparency International.

The achievement marked Phuket being awarded "AA" ("double A") status under International Transparency Assessment (ITA) guidelines, after assessment of "integrity and transparency in the operation of government agencies", Mr Suksan explained.

He highlighted seven local government bodies for their contribution to Phuket receiving the award: Phuket City Municipality, Cherng Talay Municipality, Koh Kaew Municipal-

ity, Wichit Municipality, Pa Khlok Municipality, Thepkrasattri Tambon Administrative Organisation (*OrBor-Tor*) and Patong Municipality.

After receiving the award on behalf of the province, Vice Governor Piyapong presided over a declaration of intent to combat corruption and announced a no-gift policy, or a gift for performing duties, and reminded the officials present of the policy for government officials in the Phuket area to act with integrity.

As part of the proceedings the officials present were shown a video of Prime Minister and Minister of...





Phuket launches 100% helmet campaign

huket Provincial Police have launched a new "100% helmet" campaign, and will start enforcing increasing fines for motorbike riders and passengers repeatedly caught not wearing helmets, Phuket Provincial Police Commander Maj Gen Sermphan Sirikong has announced.

The declaration came at an event held to launch the campaign at the Phuket Provincial Police headquarters in Phuket Town on Monday (Dec 13).

Region 8 Police Commander Lt Gen Amphol Buarabphon led a similar event in Patong at the same Buarabphon, Commander of Provintime on Monday afternoon.

"The project is a campaign for people to be aware of the traffic rules and to reduce the loss of life.

"In Phuket today, every police station across the island has implemented the project," Maj Gen Sermphan said.

Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Lt Col Sathit Nurit explained, "Now, road accidents cause loss of life and property, including



the economy. Most of this happens with motorcyclists, especially those who do not wear helmets.

"As a result, Pol Lt Gen Amphol cial Police Region 8, has instructed all police stations under the Provincial Police Headquarters Region 8 to offender, and the offender must implement such a project.

"The purpose is to encourage motorcyclists, both riders and passengers to realise the importance of wearing a helmet," he said.

"This will help prevent and reduce severe accidents that will affect life and body as well as to raise awaretraffic laws by wearing a helmet while riding a motorcycle," Lt Col Sathit said.

The campaign came into force on Monday (Dec 13), with officers giving warnings, Lt Col Sathit said

"A helmet will be given to the return the helmet to police within seven days," he added.

But later motorbike drivers will be charged for not wearing a helmet, and they will be charged if their passengers are not wearing a helmet, Lt Col Sathit explained.

"The fines will increase as the ness of motorcycle users to respect campaign continues," he added.

"From Feb 1 to Mar 31 offenders which focus on 100% safe driving will be fined B200 for each time they are caught. From April 1 to May 31 next year offenders will be fined B300, and from June 1, 2022 onwards offenders will be fined at the highest rate required by law [B500]," Lt Col Sathit said.

The same scale of fines was explained by Region 8 Police Commander Lt Gen Amphol at the event in Patong, where leading officials signed a Memorandum of Understanding and a procession by big bike riders was held throughout the town.

Meanwhile, Deputy Interior Minister Nipon Boonyamanee on Monday chaired a meeting at the new Phuket Provincial Hall on the road safety campaign to be held in Phuket for the New Year holidays.

Present for the meeting were Phuket Vice Governor Amnuay Pinsuwan and and heads of relevant government departments, including the Phuket Land Transport Office.

Vice Governor Amnuay explained that the campaign will cover three main areas of road safety to be implemented by local officials.

"First are management systems

and provide effective monitoring systems at all levels," he said.

"Second are the main risk factors, with the campaign to focus on the wearing of helmets, speeding and drunk driving.

"Last are general risks in the area. This focuses on training people and inspecting the condition of vehicles and roads that pose risk of accidents," Vice Governor Amnuay said.

"This is the time of year that many tourists come to Phuket," he cautioned, adding that accidents still occurred in many areas across the island.

According to the national Thai Road Safety Council (Thai RSC), 66 people have died and 12,212 have been injured in traffic accidents in Phuket so far this year.

"Therefore, we want each subdistrict and all departments to work together to take care and focus on road accidents, and help publicise the measures to prevent accidents to the public in order to reduce road accidents during the coming New Year season, and during normal times," Mr Amnuay said.

tion of intent to mark

International Anti-Corruption Day, this year observed in Thailand under the theme, "Don't do it, don't tolerate it, don't ignore it, join Thais against cheating."

PILOT SCHEME

At the meeting on Dec 9, Phuket was also announced as one of 11 provinces under a pilot project to encourage public participation in the fight against corruption.

Present to make the announcement were Pracha Terat, Chairperson of the Office of the Public Sector Anti-Corruption Commission (PACC) Subcommittee on Strengthening and Enhancing Civil Society Participation, and Tossaporn Ratanamasthip, of the Royal Thai Armed Forces' National Defence Studies Institute.

The other provinces involved in the pilot project were Saraburi, Amnat Charoen, Chiang Mai, Chonburi, Samut Prakan, Buriram, Nakhon Sawan, Prachuap Khiri Khan, explained.

The campaign is part of the national reform plan combined

under the government's "Big Rock" platform, Mr Pracha

Some 881 "Big Rock" national reform projects are to be rolled out, at an estimated cost of B65.5 billion, mostly tapped from this and next year's fiscal budgets and the central fund.

The Cabinet has approved the Big Rock policy in May, five months before Pol Col Thitisan Utthanaphon, the nowformer Chief of the Nakhon Sawan Police also known as "Joe Ferrari", and six others were indicted on four charges for torturing to death 24-yearold drug suspect Chiraphong Thanapat while trying to extort B2 million from him during an interrogation on Aug 5.

"Public participation in surveillance and recommendations on the mission of government agencies according to the principles of good city management service helps network partners to promote good governance against corruption and support the work of the provincial community organizations," Mr Pracha noted.

"It also showcases the origins and importance of Big Rock, promoting public participation in the fight against corruption under the revised national reform plan the prevention and suppression of corruption and misconduct," he said.





Swiss man, 57, killed in taxi van wipeout

57-year-old Swiss man was killed when the driver of a passenger van lost control while coming down a steep hill north of Promthep Cape on Monday morning (Dec 13).

The van swerved across the road and struck the Swiss man on his motorbike before slamming into a roadside power pole.

Acting Lt Col Ying Pimprapat of the Chalong Police was called to the scene, on the coastal road south of Nai Harn Lake, at around 8am. Acting Lt Col Ying was told that a foreign tourist had been seriously injured in an accident.

Police along with paramedics from Rawai Municipality and an ambulance from Chalong Hospital arrived at the scene to find the Phuketregistered commercial passenger van, fitted with green licence plates, on its side beside the road.

The driver, Somchai Kobkoi, 44, was waiting at the scene.



A Phuket-registered Yamaha N-Max scooter-motorbike destroyed by the force of the impact was beside the power the impact.

The Swiss man, identified by his passport as Carlo Rino Silvio Franciolli, from Lostallo, near the Italian border, was on the ground beside the motorbike. He was seriously injured, unconscious and unresponsive.

Emergency responders performed CPR and rushed him to Chalong Hospital, where he was pronounced the witness statement was

Family of slain motorbike taxi driver still 'clueless' as to reason for murder

FAMILY AND FRIENDS of the motorbike taxi driver shot dead at Phuket Bus Terminal 2, north of Phuket Town, on the night of Dec 4 are still without any clue as to why the execution was carried out.

The victim, Champa Wanchan, 54, was shot dead while sitting in a white plastic chair in the parking area for motorcycle taxis at the bus terminal at about 10:20pm.

Witnesses confirmed that the man who shot Mr Champa multiple times at close range was Vean Aiadchuthong, well known at the bus station for shooting dead two rival motorbike taxi drivers at the same venue in January.

Vean was out on bail so he could prepare his defence against the double homicide charges he was already facing.

Mr Champa's wife and daughters last Saturday (Dec 11) escorted Mr Champa's body to Wat Kosit Wiharn, little over two kilometres south of the bus station where he was slain.

Last Saturday marked the last day of prayers before Mr Champa's body was cremated. Present to pay their respects were friends and fam-

ily, and fellow motorbike taxi

drivers from the bus station.

One of Mr Champa's daughters said the family was still clueless as to why her father was murdered.

After Vean was arrested at his accommodation in Phuket Town, he was brought in for questioning, she said.

However, Vean has since denied carrying out the execution, admitting only to coming to the bus station on that night, she added.

In addition to the charges he already faces for the double murder at the bus station in January, Vean now faces additional charges of murder, illegal possession of a firearm and carrying a firearm in a public area without permission or reasonable cause.

Construction of Islamic centre begins

The blessing ceremony to begin construction of a B56 million Islamic Ethics Training Center at the northern end of Phuket was held last Sunday (Dec 12), completing a rite that allows construction to begin at the site, next to Thalang Technical College on the main road leading to the airport.

The project is being funded by the Phuket Provincial Administration Organisation (PPAO, or OrBorJor).

Present to lead the official part of the event was PPAO President Rewat Areerob, joined by other leading PPAO council members as well as Thalang District Chief Suwit Suriyawong and a host of other local officials.

Also present was Komol Dumlak, Chairman of the Phuket Islamic Committee, and representatives of the Phuket Provincial Islamic Women's Affairs Working Group.

"The PPAO has foreseen the importance of every religion that the people of Phuket respect. Therefore, the construction of an Islamic Ethics Training Center in Phuket Province has been established. as a venue for meetings, training, seminars and various activities for children, youth and the general public," Mr Rewat said.



"The centre is for promoting to children, youth and the general public to cultivate morals and ethics. It is to be a place to support religious activities at the provincial, regional and national level," he added.

The project has previously been the target of malicious posts online, claiming that the Phuket government was spending B250mn on the project.

Pol Col Krishna Pattanacharoen, deputy spokesman for the Royal Thai Police, in October revealed that the national Anti-Fake News Center had confirmed the posts online as bogus after "checking facts" with the Phuket Public Relations office (PR Phuket).

PR Phuket confirmed a construction project was in the pipeline but for an Islamic Ethics Training Center as part of the policy of promoting and upholding all religions, and not building a mosque.

The PR Phuket office also added that the allocated budget for the project had been set at B56mn as part of the 2019 fiscal budget, and not B250mn as claimed in the post.

Adding to the issues surrounding contruction of the centre is that the 19-rai site next to the Thalang Technical College is located within the boundaries of the Bang Khanun National Protected Forest.

"Permission to build had been granted to the PPAO by the Forest Department and a contract has been signed and full surveyance completed to establish the construction boundaries," the Anti-Fake News Center explained.

Col Krishna reiterated that people should not trust such inaccurate information and called for cooperation from people to not share such information on social media channels.

He added that fake news is damaging in that it not only distorts the facts but can confuse people and ultimately be detrimental to the country.

However, the land around Thalang Technical College is currently under investigation by the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) to determine which land remains private property as evidence of occupation and ownership presented by some claimants date back to before the decree establishing the protected forest reserve.

According to the DSI, a check of land holdings by people in the Bang Khanun National Reserved Forest found that there are 265 people who have rights to and use the forest area, totaling 310 plots, with an area of more than 2,698 rai.

New road to connect Pa Khlok and Srisoonthorn

THE PHUKET PROVINCIAL Administration Organisation (PPAO, or OrBorJor) has officially opened a new road between Na Nuea and Khuan Ta Taen to help people travelling from Pa Khlok to Srisoonthorn and back.

The official opening ceremony was held in Pa Khlok last Saturday (Dec 11), presided over by PPAO President Rewat Areerob.

PPAO officials, the management team from the construction company, local community leaders and local residents.

PPAO Deputy Palad Chutima Sanitprem said that the local road renovation project was included in the local development plan for 2018-2022 years and was allocated a budget of B2.45 million.

The road constructed is 1.1km long and six metres wide.

Crewman dies as fishing ship sinks

RESCUE WORKERS LATE LAST Sunday recovered the body of a fisherman who was left adrift in the water after the fishing boat he was on struck a sunken vessel and started taking on water off Phuket's east coast late last Saturday night (Dec 11).

Two other fishermen on the boat, the Chokhongthong, were rescued.

Crewman Jaroon Juprasert, 68, told the reporters after he was brought ashore at Saphan Hin that he and two others on board were coming back to Phuket after having spent four days at sea catching fish. The catch was not big due to weather conditions,

About 8:20pm, somewhere between Koh Tapao Yai and Koh Tapao Noi, about three or four kilometres from Phuket, the Chokhongthong struck the wreck of a sunken ship and began to sink slowly, Mr Jaroon explained.

The captain ordered his crew to put on life jackets, connect each other with a rope tied to the vessel and also tie empty water bottles for better buoyancy. Yet, one of the crew – Prakanchai Suparat, 60 – was lost in the sea. It is believed that the rope that was attached to him was probably loose.

Mr Prakanchai still had his life jacket and drinking water on him.

A Royal Thai Navy helicopter, Marine Police and Kusoldharm rescue workers in a rubber dinghy continued their search last Sunday, scouring Phuket Bay for Mr Prakanchai.

They finally found a body matching his description among mangroves about one kilometre from the mouth of the Klong Koh Phi canal.

The body was brought back to Saphan Hin, where relatives confirmed it was that of Mr Prakanchai.

His body was taken to Vachira Phuket Hospital for post-mortem examination in the hope of confirming the cause of death. Eakkapop Thongtub


lan Cooke, who served as the British Honorary Consul in Phuket from 2001 to 2008, for which he was awarded an MBE (Member of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire) personally received from HM Queen Elizabeth II, has passed away.

Mr Cooke, or just "Cookie" to his friends, passed away at his home in Phuket last Wednesday (Dec 8). He was

"It is with great sadness I announce my dear friend and predecessor in the role of British Honorary Consul to Phuket passed away peacefully at his home today in Phuket... Rest in Peace Alan," wrote Martin Carpenter, who himself served as British Honorary Consul in Phuket for 12 years.

Mr Cooke was awarded the MBE for his dedicated assistance provided to British nationals, especially during the 2004 tsunami and the disastrous crash of One-Two-Go Flight OG 269 at Phuket International Airport three years later.

He also started the Hash



House Harriers in Phuket and was instrumental in building Phuket's Deep Sea Port.

Even his "retirement" in Phuket could not contain him to his Island Furniture store still open today on Chao Fa West Rd in Wichit. Alan found himself also called to help create the Phuket International Boat Show (PIMEX), acting as initial consultant to Gulu Lalvani in the construction of Royal Phuket Marina, and to lobby successfully in the abolition of some, and the reduction of other, boat import taxes and duties to Thailand.

He also established the Alan Cooke Cricket Ground (ACG) in Thalang, which stands as his legacy in creating Phuket's first cricket league.

Prior to Alan's funeral on Wednesday this week (Dec 15), his body was kept in vigil at his home in Thalang.

Khun Siriporn, Alan's long standing partner in Phuket, invited friends to pay their respects at the house each evening through Tuesday (Dec 14), with prayers taking place from 7:30pm each day.

On Tuesday evening, after the prayers there was an 'Open House' wake with refreshments served.

Alan's funeral and cremation was held on Wednesday (Dec 15) at Manik Temple from 11:30am, followed by a celebration of Alan's life at the Alan Cooke Cricket Ground.

Hashers, past members of the British Business Association Phuket, cricketers, colleagues and friends of Alan, were all welcomed to pay their respects.

An outpouring of condolences for Alan's friends and family have streamed online since news of Alan's passing broke.

"Very sad to hear this, he was a real gentleman and pillar of the community May he Rest in Peace," wrote fellow Phuket pioneer and long-term expat Neil Cumming.

"RIP Alan and thank you for your generous contribution of the ACG for kids and adults alike...," wrote Stewart Lees.

Ian Hewett, well known for his long-standing role in Phuket's marine industry, wrote, "So sorry to read this. I met Alan just after the Tsunami when we took a speedboat to Phi Phi and around the bay. I was looking for missing charter boats and Alan wanted to see for himself what the situation was."

"Really sad news. A pillar of society, I enjoyed his sardonic wit on many occasions. Sincere condolences to his family & friends. RIP Alan," wrote friend Peter Notley.

Phuket's cricketing community, deeply grateful for Alan's role in establishing cricket on the island, marked his passing through their Phuket Cricket Facebook page.

"Very sad news for Phuket and Phuket Cricket. Alan did so much for Phuket Cricket through his love of the magnificent game. Thoughts are with his family and friends in these difficult times," the group wrote.

"We will forever be grateful for the magnificent venue that is the Alan Cooke Ground (ACG), where we all have shared so many good times and will continue to do so. RIP Alan."

Gems fair hoped to generate B150mn

A GEMS AND JEWELLERY FAIR HELD in Phuket from Dec 9-12 is hoped to generate B150 million in sales to help boost the island's economy.

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Commerce Jurin Laksanawisit officiated the opening of the Phuket Gems & Jewelry Fest at Central Festival Phuket, joined by Ministry of Commerce Permanent Secretary Bunyarit Kalayanamit and Department of International Trade Promotion Director-General Phusit Rattanakul Sereeruengrit.

A total of 79 international buyers registered for the Phuket fair, altogether hailing from 31 countries, including the United States, Russia, Spain, India, the United Arab Emirates, among others, he added.

"Orders and contracts are expected imme-

ourism officials have launched a slew of food festivals to be held in Phuket throughout December in the hope of boosting domestic travel to the island to help the local economy.

"It helps to promote the image of Phuket as a City of Creative Gastronomy as recognised by UNESCO, and it helps generate income for all sectors from upstream to downstream, from local communities to restaurants and hotels, which promotes a sustainable economy," Mr Chai said.

Mr Apichai of the TAT noted, "Highlighting the medicinal benefits of Thai food will encourage tourists to be interested in traveling to visit the source of herbs and raw ingredients as well as to find the owner of the recipe who cooks the dish.

"This is the true meaning of valuable culinary tourism, because it gives tourists the opportunity to complete a variety of experiences related to food. It also benefits the local community and business operators in the tourism industry, and in all sectors, leading to the creation of food tourism

in a truly sustainable way."

Irin Riksasan, project manager of the festival, explained that the festival is packed with activities in Phuket throughout December, such as the "Thai Taste Therapy Trip" Phuket travel packages.

Thai Smile Airways has also joined to support the campaign.

Sanchan Sathapornwuthikhun, Director of Inflight Services at Thai Smile Airways said, "Thai Smile and MasterCard will take everyone on a journey to explore delicious and healthy dishes at famous

restaurants in the Thai Taste Therapy editions to be held in six locations: Chiang Rai, Nan, Chiang Mai, Surat Thani, Krabi and Phuket."

The airline is offering discounts on tickets bought for flights to those destinations paid for via Mastercard, he added.

GOING LOCAL

Rewat Areerob, President of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organisation (PPAO, or *OrBorJor*), has announced a series of food and goods festivals to be held in Phuket in December and January to help boost local people's incomes.

The "Rhoi Nat Yat Dai" festival ("Food & Goods Festival") will first take place at Patong Beach on Dec 17-19.

"This event is a continuation of the 'Roi Rim Lay' festival, which is a project to strengthen the foundation of Phuket's economy, and aims to stimulate and revitalise Phuket's economy after being affected by the COVID-19 epidemic," Mr Rewat explained.

The first edition will be held at Patong Beach on Dec 17-19. The highlight of the event is 'O-Tao Giant Pan'

[in which the popular oysterbased dish will be cooked in a giant wok], which will be offered for free tastings for visitors," he said.

The second edition of the festival will be held at Sanam Chai, located opposite Phuket Provincial Hall on Narisorn Rd, in Phuket Town on Jan 7-9. The third event will be held at Laguna Phuket in Cherng Talay, Thalang, on Feb 4-6.

"The purpose of this event aims to encourage people to put their money into the Phuket economy, which will bring real benefits to the people, namely farmers, producers and local business owners who will be able to make more money," Mr Rewat explained.

"It also promotes tourism in Phuket by bringing food and cultural identity, including the use of traditional Phuket costumes during tourism presentations," Mr Rewat said.

"This event also is part of the campaign to reduce global warming. The event will not use foam in food packaging and no alcoholic beverages will be sold as well," Mr Rewat said.

Live entertainment will also be performed at the events, he added.

Premchai sent to prison over 'black leopard case'

he Supreme Court has sentenced construction tycoon Premchai Karnasuta to a prison term of three years and two months for hunting in Thungyai Naresuan Wildlife Sanctuary nearly four years ago, known as the "black leopard case".

The ruling was read out at Thong Pha Phum District Court last Wednesday (Dec 8) but was shrouded in confusion after the initial reading by the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) was incorrect.

The OAG, through its spokesman Itthiporn Kaewthip and deputy spokesman Prayut Phetchakhun, originally said Premchai was sentenced to two years and six months for hunting in Thungyai Naresuan Wildlife Sanctuary nearly four years ago, his former driver to two years and nine months in prison and his hunter to three years and one month.

The announcement said the Supreme Court reduced the Appeal Court's sentences by eight months because a

change to the Wild Animal Preservation and Protection Act two years ago removed "acceptance" of wildlife carcasses as an offence.

The OAG later sent a message to the media correcting the sentences and apologising for the misinformation. It said the amendment to the law had no effect on the prison terms of the three men.

All three were in fact acquitted on the carcass acceptance count but were still found guilty of possessing wildlife carcasses and their jail terms

of eight months for this offence remained in force.

Premchai, the 66-yearold president of Italian-Thai Development Plc, arrived at the court with a walking cane and a bandage over his left eye. The two other defendants in the case were also present at the court.

His former driver Yong Dodkruea, 68, was sentenced to three years and five months in prison and his hunter Thanee Thummat, 59, to three years and nine months.

The Supreme Court upheld

the Appeal Court's order that they pay B2 million in compensation for damage to nature resulting from their illegal hunting.

The defendants were ordered to be fitted with electronic tags while waiting to be taken Thong Pha Phum prison. They were also tested for COVID-19.

The three defendants, along with a woman cook, were arrested at their camp in Thungyai Naresuan Wildlife Sanctuary in Tambon Chalae of Thong Pha Phum district on Feb 4, 2018, for hunting of wildlife, including killing a rare black panther, a kalij pheasant and a barking deer. They also faced other related charges.

In December 2019, the Appeal Court sentenced Premchai to three years and two months in prison, Yong to three years and five months and Thanee to three years and nine months. All three appealed to the Supreme Court.

Nathee Riemsaen, the 46-year-old cook, was given a suspended prison term of one year and eight months. She did not appeal the sentence.

Thai COVID response best in Southeast Asia

BANGKOK

THAILAND RANKS FIFTH among 195 countries in the 2021 Global Health Security (GHS) Index, leading Southeast Asia in terms of the quickest response to COVID-19.

Deputy government spokeswoman Rachada Dhnadirek said Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha would like to thank medical frontliners, other related parties and the Thai people for their cooperation in following the government's COVID-19 measures.

Public Health Minister Anutin Charnvirakul said Thailand's rank was an improvement on the 2019 GHS Index, when it placed sixth. This year, the country earned an average total of 68.2 points out of 100. In the category of rapid detection and reporting, it ranked No.1 (91.5 points), he said.

The report, released by the Nuclear Threat Initiative (NTI) and the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security at the Bloomberg School of Public Health, with research conducted by Economist Impact, measured the capacities of 195 countries to prepare

for epidemics and pandemics.

The United States topped the chart followed by Australia, Finland, Canada, Thailand, Slovenia, the United Kingdom, Germany, South Korea and Sweden.

In Southeast Asia, Thailand led, followed by Singapore (24th), Malaysia (27th), Indonesia (45th), the Philippines (57th), Brunei (64th), Vietnam (65th), Myanmar (85th) and Laos (99th).

Although the government was pleased with the nation's ranking, the data demonstrated that all countries including Thailand have insufficient health capacities over a longer duration, leaving the world acutely vulnerable to future health emergencies.

The GHS Index shows the foundational elements that leaders should prepare their countries for to avoid future outbreaks. *Bangkok Post*





How to lead Gen Z'ers

Coaching leadership style is a good choice because it unlocks the hidden skills in people without fundamentally changing who they are, making Gen Z'ers happier in the workspace. This style is similar to a coach in the sporting world who directs the team to SHCCESS

Here are the keys to successful coaching leadership:

Start with trust. Build trust by forging a relationship with your team. A good leader will not tell the team what to do, a two-way conversation is needed. Ask questions and listen more to better understand the team member's work motivation.

Let them engage more. Coaching is different from commanding; it is

focused on developing the people. Collaborating and working together with your team will unlock their potential. It will enable them to have their own standpoint or style of working and help elevate team performance in the long run. In return, your team will be able to coach others in the future.

Provide feedback. Don't complain. Complaining is useless, it never makes things better. If you want your team members to fix a problem, instead of complaining, give constructive feedback to help them learn and understand what they need to improve. By doing so, you will boost your team's performance, while at the same time not destroying their confidence.

Support your team. Support your team members' ideas and provide the necessary resources and tools they need. Being supportive will help them perform better and increase their creativity.





Hazlewood out of Adelaide Test

AUSTRALIA WERE DEALT A BLOW on Monday (Dec 13) when paceman Josh Hazlewood was ruled out of the second Ashes Test against England in Adelaide, with Jhye Richardson or Michael Neser in line to replace him.

The 30-year-old suffered a side strain during Australia's nine-wicket thumping of the visitors in the opening Test at Brisbane and has returned home to rest.

"Hazlewood returned to Sydney yesterday afternoon for further assessment and rehabilitation with a decision on his fitness for the Boxing Day Test (in Melbourne) to be made in due course," Cricket Australia said.

His absence is a big blow ahead of the Adelaide day-night Test which started yesterday (Dec 16), with Hazlewood boasting a pink-ball record of 32 wickets at just 19.90.

Brisbane, although after an overnight scan he did get through six overs on day four.

Australian captain Pat Cummins said at the time Hazlewood was "a bit sore".

"[It's] nothing too serious but didn't want it to turn into a huge injury," Cummins said then.

Richardson is widely seen as favourite to replace him and join Cummins and Mitchell Starc as Australia's three-pronged pace attack in what would be only his third Test.

The 25-year-old played his only two Tests against Sri Lanka almost three years ago but has been in outstanding early season

Sheffield Shield form. The uncapped Neser has also been in good early season nick.

Australia is further sweating on the fitness of David Warner who is nursing bruised ribs.

The explosive opener scored 94 in He didn't bowl on the third afternoon in Brisbane but didn't bat in Australia's second innings when just 20 runs were needed to win.

> Cummins said after the Test that he expected Warner to recover in time, with the experienced Usman Khawaja waiting in the wings should he not be fit.

> Meanwhile, England captain Joe Root has said his team must fix their fielding and batting to get back into the series.

Klopp backs Gerrard as Thai War Elephants his successor at Anfield

urgen Klopp said he would "love" Steven Gerrard to be his successor after ensuring the former Liverpool captain's return to Anfield as Aston Villa manager ended in a 1-0 defeat last Saturday (Dec 11).

Mohamed Salah's secondhalf penalty secured a vital three points for the Reds as, at time of press, they remain just one point behind Manchester City at the top of the Premier League.

Klopp's men should have been more convincing winners as they dominated the vast majority of the game although they had to withstand a nervy finale where Gerrard believed his side should have been awarded a penalty when Alisson Becker bundled over Danny Ings.

"The first 75 minutes was incredible football," said Klopp. "We played in the spaces we wanted to play but we did not finish the situations which is tricky.

"We scored with the penalty then the relief was obviously too big and it was an unnecessary open game. [The last 15 minutes] was like tooth ache! Nobody needs that."

Gerrard said before the game he would gladly sacrifice some of his legendary status among the Liverpool support for a result on his first trip to Anfield as part of the visiting team.

The man who scored 186 goals in 710 games as a Liverpool player was welcomed with gentle applause as he emerged from the tunnel, but there was no great fanfare for his return until the Kop chanted his name shortly after the full-time whistle.

"You have to understand when you come to the Premier League, you are going to have these days," said Gerrard. "There is a lot of emotion, but I tried to focus on Aston Villa and make sure that is the priority."

Gerrard, who joined Villa last month after three and a half years as Rangers manager, has been tipped as Klopp's successor when the German's contract expires in 2024.

"The good thing is I have no problem with this sort of thing," said Klopp on the speculation over his future. "I will not be here forever so I would love it to be Stevie, but no I did not feel under pressure today."

Gerrard admitted there "was a level between the sides" for the majority of the match as Villa were camped inside their own half although he was adamant his side deserved a penalty.

"For me there were two penalty incidents in the game. They got theirs, we don't get ours," said Gerrard.

"You can be too gung ho against these sides too early. The plan was to take it to the latter stages and then get more of our attacking players on the field.

"Hopefully I can be more bold and ambitious against these sides in the future."

ax Verstappen is a Formula 1 champion at last, and though the circumstances of his triumph over Lewis Hamilton were controversial, his place in the pantheon of motorsport greats is secure.

F1 in 2021 was never going to go quietly. Verstappen Lewis Hamilton had fought too hard, put too much on the line, for this most enthralling season to simply fade away. The Abu Dhabi Grand Prix last Sunday (Dec 12) was always going to be something special.

The twist took 53 of 58 laps to reveal itself in the guise of Nicholas Latifi's crashed Williams. The Canadian was unhurt, but the deployment of the safety car did serious damage to the lead Hamilton had worked hard to construct in a dominant race performance.

Verstappen, running second with nothing to lose, stopped for fresh tyres. Hamilton, with everything to lose, could only stay out.

Only five lapped cars buffered the leader from the fresh-tyred Verstappen, but in a bizarre decision by race control those five cars alone were allowed to unlap themselves, leaving Verstappen to fill Hamilton's mirrors as the race resumed for one final lap.

Mercedes boss Toto Wolff howled with rage over his radio connection to race director

Michael Masi, but it was in vain. It took just five corners for Verstappen to exploit his new rubber, and he scythed into the lead with a daring late-braking move to break the points deadlock in his favour and claim his maiden world championship.

"It's unbelievable," Verstappen said. "It's insane. I don't know what to say."

Mercedes was thinking the same. The team protested the result on the grounds that race control had broken its own rules on lapped cars and safety car restarts, and when the stewards rejected the argument, Mercedes lodged an intention to appeal directly to the governing body's tribunal, potentially holding up the formalising of the result for weeks.

Race control would appear to have a case to answer, and it's a pity this classic championship has ended under the cloud of such obscure acrimony, but the delayed coronation must not prevent recognition of Verstappen as a meritorious champion.

He played his hand to perfection through the race, and it's his unerring capacity to get the most from his car and himself that has defined his season in its totality, his first in genuine championship contention. His surety when so many others would have cracked under pressure is remarkable.

The stats bear it out: he won 10 of the 22 races, claimed 10 poles and led more laps than the rest of the I think set by myself and

field combined.

Those numbers are all the more impressive for coming against the heft of Hamilton and the might of Mercedes, combined the dominant force of almost the past decade.

Rather than feel the weight of expectation, the pressure of such formidable competition drove him to these heights. Thrilling for us is that Hamilton, so good at finding extra gears when his back finally hits the wall, reached new heights of his own, and the one-upmanship continued until the new rivals were far clear of the mere mortals of the midfield and even their own teammates.

"I think in general the quality has been very high,

Lewis of course," Verstappen said. "We have been pushing each other to the limit every single time.

"In the championship that we had, that was massive, so the level of focus required was very high."

Verstappen's title has been forged in the fire of one of F1's most intense campaigns. The result is the formation of a rivalry not simply between old master and young challenger but between two iconic world champions. Between equals.

Verstappen has taken his first step into the pantheon Hamilton first entered 13 years ago. How enhanced he is by the experience remains to be seen, but for certain is that there's no turning back for F1's newest world champion.
