"There is no budget to do any food handouts in the near future. We do not know when we will have any budget to help people in this part," the staffer added.

Phuket Town Deputy Mayor It has been months since local Kavee Tansukhatanon confirmed government organisations have to The Phuket News that Phuket City Municipality has handed out A public relations staffer at emergency food supplies only twice, Patong Municipality, one of the in May and June. However, he added that the municipality spent B28 million in doing so.

"We do not have any budget [for food-donation campaigns]. We will do another one when we have the budget and the formal order from the Phuket Governor," he said.

Wal Brown, a long-term Phuket expat who earlier this year colaunched the Feeding Friends Patong campaign with fellow expat Tony Love Linay, explained that the people most affected in the Patong area have been the Myanmar migrant workers.

"The government is not giving any food support anymore. That free food has come to an end," he said.

Food donations are still obviously much needed, he added, noting

that long queues for food donations are regularly still seen lining the streets of Patong. A recent donation event, on Sept 6, saw some 300 to 400 people lining Nanai Rd, Wal explained.

Queues for food are regularly seen elsewhere across the island as charity events are held, including the recent 'Duen Sip' Buddhist festival celebrated in Baan Don, Thalang. A staffer at Cherng Talay Municipality who asked not to be named explained away those present queuing for food as local Urak Lawoi sea gypsies. Queuing for food was a "cultural thing", the staffer said. Yet, queue for food they did.

Need for food security bites back

PRIVATE EFFORTS

A host of top Phuket artists are to record a version of the classic global charity song Do They Know It's Christmas in their efforts to help continue providing food to people in Phuket and on nearby islands.

The project will be coordinated by Legend Music Recording Studio in Koh Kaew, owned and operated by producer and composer, and long-term Phuket expat, Gary Crause.

Mr Crause was one of the driving forces behind Phuket artists coming together in June to produce their own version of Lean on Me to boost food security relief efforts driven by the Help Phuket Today campaign, also created to help people in Phuket suffering without any form of income during the ongoing crisis.

"So far more than 2,000 Lean On Me Food Packs costing a total of B500,000 have been paid for by the Phuket community and distributed directly to the families and communities all over Phuket and the adjacent islands that are hardest hit by unemployment caused by the pandemic," Mr Crause explained on Monday (Sept 14).

Most recently just over 400 food packs were distributed through the Koh Kaew Tambon Administration Organisation (OrBorTor), and 20 packs were sent to Phuket Immigration, he added.

Kath Cumming started Help Phuket Today on April 12, collecting food for the hardest hit communities where families were close to starvation due to losing their jobs and income sources because of the COVID-forced lockdowns. With the help of Yvonne Symons from Villa Market and the Tourist Police, they distribute the food donations directly to the communities

that need it to survive.

After learning of their relief efforts, Mr Crause from the Phuket Academy of Performing Arts arranged with Villa Market to have a B250 barcode created for the purchase of the food packs to make it very simple for people to donate to the cause. He also called up many of his musician friends and some students to film and record a version of Lean On Me to

help drive the marketing and awareness campaign for the food relief efforts.

"All of those involved in the day-to-day running of the Lean On Me Food Donation and Distribution program know firsthand that it is a very real problem that will impact these families for a very long time," Mr Crause said.

"With the low season in full swing, and the high season looking like it will be a non-event, the current outlook is that the situation will not improve for at least another 12 to 16 months, and is in fact getting worse," he added.

To contribute to the relief efforts, simply scan and pay for Lean On Me food packs at any Villa Market in Phuket, or order the packs online via Villa Market's online shopping portal.

GRAVE CONCERNS

Wal Brown also expressed his serious concerns for the current situation's impact on people's emotional and mental well-being. His concerns coincide with Thailand's Mental Health Department on Sept 10 revealing that 2,551 people had killed themselves in the by the Social Security Office

first half of this year, up 22% for the same period last year.

Personal problems, depression, economic pressure and alcohol were the reasons leading people to take their own lives, said the department.

The rising suicide rate has reminded public health officials of the 1997 financial meltdown, when the rate leaped by between 20% and 30%, it added.

Department Director-General Kiattiphum Wongrajit linked the increase in the suicide cases this year to the outbreak of the deadly virus and described the trend as "worrisome". His assessment was in line with various studies in Thailand and abroad, reported the Bangkok Post.

STRONG MESSAGE

The National Reform Committee on Labour was told at a meeting in Phuket on Sept 11 to issue a moratorium on all outstanding debts, boost efforts to bring tourists to Phuket and provide financial support to unemployed people on the island.

Committee Chairman Charin Chakkaphak and his delegation arrived in Phuket to hear directly the key problems island residents are facing during the current economic crisis. Present at the meeting at Phuket Provincial Hall were Phuket Governor Narong Woonciew, Vice Governor Phichet Panaphong, other officials and local business owners.

V/Gov Phichet explained that Phuket is badly affected by the current crisis, and delivered three requests already presented to the Senate Standing Committee on Tourism: extend the financial support for a further three months; allow workers from other provinces to transfer their house registration to Phuket so the Phuket government can receive more budget funds to provide better care for them; and ask the Ministry of Labour to provide help to at least 1,000 unemployed in Phuket.

Further requests were presented by the private sector, including representatives from the Phuket Tourism Industry Council, Human Resources Club of Patong, the Phuket Chamber of Commerce, among others. The requests presented were: issue a moratorium on all outstanding debts for business owners and employees; relax soft loan conditions so that business owners can actually access the loans; reduce utility bills such as water and electricity; suspend student loan debts for new graduates; and strictly regulate prices of products and services in order to create a good image of Phuket

Other requests presented included one on behalf of Phuket residents for the government to encourage more Thais to travel to the island, and to support local business owners via social security funds and soft loans.

"The central government is paying much attention to Phuket and other places badly affected by the COVID-19 economic crisis, including Koh Samui," Mr Charin said.

All the information received was to be presented to the Cabinet on Tuesday (Sept 15), Mr Charin added.

After the meeting, Mr Charin and his delegation went to meet local hotel operators as well as workers at spa and massage centres in Patong.

French 'VIPs' allowed through

huket Governor Narong Woonciew has connationals were allowed to land in Phuket and spend 14 days at a hotel designated as an Alternative State Quarantine venue, then allowed to continue their journey to Cambodia.

The confirmation followed reports circulating online that four French "VIPs" were allowed to spend a 14-day holiday in Phuket - despite no foreigners currently being allowed to enter the country via Phuket.

"Four French foreigners were approved by the Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration [CCSA], the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand to arrive at Phuket International Airport," Governor Narong said.

"The four French nationals arrived by private jet, then the CCSA designated the four foreigners as a trial group and considered them as a way to test the system [for allowing foreigners into the country," he added.

Governor Narong declined to explain what reasons were given for allowing the four French nationals special per-"After that they flew to mission to land in Phuket and

spend 14 days on the island while the blanket ban on all foreigners arriving in Thailand via Phuket remains in place - as ordered by the CCSA in Bangkok.

"Testing the system for bringing foreigners into Phuket is necessary, we must slowly open the door to receive foreigners," Governor Narong said.

"Now our door is suddenly closed," he added.

"Opening the door wide to accepting foreigners coming in without testing the system is impossible. We followed all the CCSA procedures strictly every step of the way, " he said.

Governor Narong redirected the issue towards the critical need of allowing foreigners to come to Phuket to help end the financial suffering on the island.

"The efforts to bring foreigners into Phuket is for the benefit of the nation and for Phuket province. Phuket is getting 'sick' now, and the revenue generated from the tourism industry, about B400 billion a year, has all disappeared," he said.

"If we don't do anything and let it continue like this for the next four to five months, or even a year, what will happen to Phuket? How will the people of Phuket survive? Therefore economic recovery is important, as well as taking care of the health of the Phuket people," he concluded.


Governor Narong confirmed the news on Sept 8 while reviewing a "rehearsal" of the processes to allow fororeign tourists to be allowed into the country at Phuket International Airport.

The exercise was held as a practice session for the officers involved and to build confidence among the public in the disease-prevention measures, Governor Narong explained.

The rehearsal, which saw 10 actors play the part of foreign tourists arriving and undergoing each step of the testing and verification process for being allowed into the country, was video recorded and will be shared with the public to demonstrate its effectiveness, Governor Narong said.

"Now we have conducted a full rehearsal, we are waiting on Bangkok to decide whether we can receive tourists," he said.

"We are ready and waiting for the central government to approve foreigners to start entering [Thailand through Phuket]. If they do allow Phuket as a port of entry to the country, we are ready to perform the same protocols as practiced at Suvarnabhumi Airport," he added.

wo more hotels in Phuket have been inspected and approved by local health officials to serve as Alternative State Quarantine (ASQ) venues, and are now waiting for approval from Bangkok, Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) Chief Dr Thanit Sermkaew has confirmed.

Mr Thanit named the two hotels as the Metadee Phuket in Kata and the Phuket Graceland Resort & Spa in Patong.

The two hotels bring the total number of guest accommodation venues in Phuket officially approved to serve as ASQs to only four.

They join the Anantara Mai Khao Phuket and Trisara Phuket Villas and Residences, altogether offering just 469 guest rooms – despite at least 14 hotels in Phuket applying



for the privilege since late July.

Mr Thanit confirmed two weeks ago that a surge in applications saw at least 82 hotels in Phuket apply to be approved as ASQ venues.

However, some hotel operators have now removed their applications, he said.

"Many of them did not fully understand the extent of changes needed in order to meet the requirements," he explained. of them in Bangkok.

Mr Thanit told *The Phuket News* that one more hotel on the island has been inspected and is expected to also be recommended to be approved as an ASQ.

"We are just waiting on the documents to be processed," he said.

Mr Thanit maintained that the delay in having hotels in Phuket approved as ASQs was due to operators not fully understanding the extensive requirements needed to be met in order to be approved.

"Many hotels have applied and asked to be inspected, but then we find that they have more adjustments to make in order for us to recommend them to Bangkok to be approved," he said.

Mr Thanit declined to reveal which hotels in Phuket have applied for ASQ status. "Once they pass the requirements and are approved, then that information will be revealed," he said.

Despite the very slow rate of approval, Mr Thanit remained adamant that his office had adequate staffing to cope with the time-consuming inspection process.

"Our team can take this responsibility to check all 70 hotels. I do not need extra officers from Bangkok," he assured.

However, he admitted, "We have a full schedule to inspect hotels this month already."

"I am not worried about us conducting all the inspections ourselves because there is no deadline and no urgent date to finish it [the inspections] by Oct 1 anymore," Mr Thanit said.

"Now I am just waiting for the hotels to be ready so our team can go to inspect them. It takes about half a day to inspect each hotel," he added.



Tourism Minister pins hopes on events to boost Phuket economy

MINISTER FOR TOURism and Sports Phiphat Ratchakitprakarn has said that he hopes more events will be held in Phuket in order to boost the number of visitors coming to Phuket, and generate more income for residents and businesses on the island.

Mr Phiphat attended several events in Phuket last Friday (Sept 11), including the official opening of the 'We Run Phuket' fun run held at Patong Beach.

"At this stage, some businesses are still closed, and people do not have income, so I hope sport events can be a part to stimulate tourism and the economy and make income for local people," Mr Phiphat said.

Present at the opening ceremony were Phuket Vice Governor Phichet Panaphong, Patong Mayor Chalermluck Kebsup, and other officials.

Mr Phiphat explained that the Ministry of Tourism and Sports chose to hold the event in Phuket, as Phuket is the second-highest income generating province in the country and was badly affected by the COVID-19 crisis.

"More than 1,000 runners from 60 provinces applied to

Plans to grow medical marijuana start to bloom

he Phuket Public Health Office held a workshop last week to raise awareness among people in Phuket looking to grow marijauana for medical and research purposes.

Joining the workshop, held at Phuket Rajabhat University last Thursday (Sept 10), were Phuket Vice Governor Phichet Panaphong, PPHO Chief Dr Thanit Sermkaew and University President Asst Prof Dr Hiran Prasarnkan.

The workshop focussed on marijauna cultivation and processing for medical use and research purposes.

PPHO Chief Dr Thanit made it very clear that a permit from the Ministry of Health was required in order to legally grow marijuana for such purposes.

He did not explain whether such permits were already available.

Dr Thanit also made it plain that marijuana remains a Category 5 controlled substance under the Narcotics



Act (No. 7) B.E. 2562.

"But the Minister of Public Health has issued a policy to allow people safe access to the use of marijuana and medical herbs," he said.

Hence the workshop explained the law regulating the growing and production of marijuana and the process of applying for permission to plant, produce and distribute marijuana as a Category 5 drug, he explained.

"This also means safely growing marijuana, and

educating people in how to prepare the planting area to prepare the soil and consider the weather conditions for cultivation for farmers in Phuket," he said.

Other issues explained were measures to control the quality of marijuana grown and how to test for residues in the soil, such as heavy metals or pesticides.

"We also need to look at dry processing marijuana and producing hemp oil to provide medical and research

benefits," Dr Thanit said.

Vice Governor Phichet pointed out that the growing of marijuana for medical use could bring much benefit to the people.

"Every aspect of growing marijuana can bring us more knowledge, especially in the medical benefits of using treatments made from marijuana. Further study of its uses can help the future treatment of various diseases and medical conditions,"

Tsunami drill reveals tower needs repairs

THE TSUNAMI-EVACUAtion drill conducted in Kamala last week revealed that the speakers on one of the warning towers in the beach resort town needs repairs after failing to adequately sound the alarm during the simulation exercise.

At a review meeting held after the the drill, which started at 10am last Wednesday (Sept 9) with the sirens sounding the alarm at four locations in Kamala, Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM) Phuket office Chief Sophon Thongsai explained that the main purpose of the drill was to check the readiness of the warning sirens as well as the readiness of local people in responding to alarm.

The simulation itself involved officers being notified of an 8.5-Magnitude underwater earthquake striking some 10 kilometres deep northeast of Great Nicobar Island, an island in the Andaman and Nicobar archipelago located some 200km west of Phuket.

Phuket Vice Governor Wongsakorn Nunchukan has praised the exercise generally as a success.

However, while V/Gov Wongsakorn noted that the warning tower behind Kamala


Police Station sounded the warning loudly, he also pointed out that the speakers in the tower near the Samnaksong Charoentham temple were not loud and needed repair.


Mr Sopohon pointed out that the towers and their equipment had been in use "for quite some time".


"We will inform the DDPM headquarters [in Bangkok] about the broken speakers and other equipment so they can be repaired," he said.

Inaugural Thailand Plant-Based Food Awards open for voting

ometimes helping the planet can seem like an impossible task. As individuals, we know that we should use less plastic, we know we should drive and fly less, buy locally and waste less, but the single biggest measure we can take to reduce environmental pollution, water usage and deforestation, is to eat more plant-based foods.

This is the main driving force behind Root The Future, a Thailandbased sustainability organisation that is on a very serious mission to reduce environmental impact by assessing and changing what we eat. Their aim is to grow the plant-based and sustainability movement in Thailand by producing video content that promotes the diversity of plant-based food.

"Eating plant-based is the single biggest way we can reduce our environmental impact and we want to get this message out to the world," commented Joanna Broomfield, co-founder of Root The Future.

"Our ultimate goal is to save the world by changing what is on our plates. And to create a change within our food systems by advocating for more sustainable business practices," Joanna added.

The group recently launched Thailand's first Plant-Based Food Awards which will include restaurants based in Phuket, Bangkok and Chiang Mai.

The winners will be announced on World Food Day (Oct 16) to coincide with the vegetarian festival and featured in a full page spread in the *Bangkok Post* that same day.

"The winners list will be a great resource for those who want to eat more plant-based food," said Joanna.

"We hope this will expose delicious plant-based food to festival participants that may not have otherwise known about it, maybe even leading to these people choosing more plant-based options in the future."

Voting opened on Aug 30 and runs until Oct 4. The campaign is completely non-profit and free to participate for any business or restaurant in Bangkok, Chiang Mai and Phuket that have one or more plant-based options on their menus.

Vouchers worth B5,000 will also be given away to five lucky voters.

The Root The Future awards launch video has seen several prominent figures help raise awareness and spread the plant-based and sustainability message via various social media platforms to their significant legions of followers. This includes: Warattha Imraporn (915k followers), Noon Siraphun (237k followers), Top Pipat (65k followers), Pun Pun (7.4 million followers), Giada (48.2k followers) and Tachaya (414k followers).



Wild and Crazy

e live in crazy times and the wild ride which humanity is currently experiencing is only going to get more severe and unpredictable. We are haunted by not only the horror of COVID-19

and the economic apocalypse it has unleashed, but also the unending deluge of media overload which permeates our every waking moment.

One way to counteract this tide of despondency is to get out into the fresh air and wild country on a sturdy mountain bike and head off-road into Thailand's now largely empty, clean and rapidly-regenerating natural realm in all its present glory.

I planned such an off-road adventure recently and wanted to include some 'wild swimming' too. There's currently a huge groundswell of interest in this outdoor form of adventure due to the fact that no-one wants to go to their local, crowded, swimming pool in the current climate.

So it was that a recent overcast monsoonal morning saw me driving off Phuket, muddy mountain bike strapped to my car's bike-rack, my swimming trunks packed alongside cycling shorts, plus my rather nervous little dog named "Cutie" coming along for her first upcountry adventure.


Driving north to our first stop at Khao Lak was a breeze. Not only was traffic light, but fellow drivers actually seemed less stressed and more accommodating than in our 'normal' febrile touristic times.

We drove into a largely deserted Khao Lak by mid-afternoon to the lovely Nangthong Beach Resort, where an air-conditioned cottage right on the eponymous beach cost a bargain B1,300 a night.

As evening cast pink and golden tentacles across the sun-westering sky, I rode the back lanes and off-road tracks in the area with Cutie in my backpack. We disturbed an insouciant monitor lizard dozing on a little road which would normally be thronged with tourist traffic. All around us birds, butterflies and insects seemed to be celebrating the lack of humanity by their abundant presence and the air was cleaner than I can ever remember.

To complete my wild ride, I took a wild swim in the crashing spume of Nongthon Bay towards the rocky outcrop topped by its little spaceshipshaped lighthouse, as flickers of soft lightning danced within the billowing Cumulus clouds overhead... a fitting end to my first wild and crazy day.

Next morning, we headed up coastal Highway 4 to Takuapa, then east on the 401 across the Isthmus of Kra to-



wards Surat Thani. As we approached the Khao Sok National Park, it was like awakening in another universe. You know you are in for something special when the scenery becomes at first dramatic and then simply breath-taking with huge limestone cliffs rising sheer from the verdant rainforest floor and towering majestically skywards.

A well-marked left turn from Highway 401 took me onto the little road to one of the world's oldest, most pristine natural rainforests and to our stay at an ultimate wild adventure hotspot, Dick Sandler's iconic Our Jungle House resort on the banks of the Sok River.


Although the main park is open at present, I decided to ride several of the back trails from the resort. I rode on un-

paved tracks through rubber plantations over several big climbs from the resort back towards the main Highway 401.

Atop a crest I came to the small lake which I'd seen on previous visits and it was here I decided to try my first freshwater wild swim. I stripped down to my trunks and took the plunge into the dark depths feeling the still waters temper my sweat-drenched body with a cool embrace.

I swam out into the middle of the lake and floated on my back looking upwards at the surrounding trees, the far-off cliffs and karsts and the first golden traces of the rising moon.

The combination of wild swimming and cycling was most definitely a muchneeded way to achieve transcendence in these wild and crazy times.

of five places to bad getaways at the two restarts, but kept his cool through the carnage to take his maiden F1 podium, sealing the deal with a brilliant move around Daniel Ricciardo's outside at turn one.

As has so often been the case this season, the Red Bull Racing driver was ferocious in the race, picking off drivers one by one with some perfectly judged passing to earn the place on merit.

"It's taken a while to get here," Albon told *Sky Sports* post race.

"It was a tough one as well, I had to work for it. I'm really happy. I can breathe. It feels nice to be here," he added.

Albon was also quick to thank his team for their ongoing support: "The team has supported me since day one. It's really good to get a podium, just to show that I can do it."

The achievement was all the sweeter as Albon's seat at Red Bull Racing has been the subject of continued speculation after he traded places with Pierre Gasly last year, with the Frenchman demoted back to Toro Rosso (now AlphaTauri).

'TOO NICE'

Christian Horner, Red Bull Racing team boss, who had stated earlier last week that the team were more than happy with the Thai driver, said he was delighted for him after last Sunday's result.

"He's weathered a bit of criticism, he's bounded back," Horner told Sky Sports.

"To be fair, the last couple of weekends he's been getting stronger and stronger.

"For him to get that podium today, he had to really fight for it. He had to do it the hard way."

On crossing the finish line and securing the third place finish, Albon immediately paid thanks to his team, exclaiming: "Thanks for sticking with me."

Asked to comment on this, Horner stated his driver could be "too nice."

"But once he puts the helmet on, you can see there's a real racer in there. There's a big difference between thinking you can do it and knowing you can do it. I think this podium for him will just give him a boost of confidence and self-belief.

"I think he really will build from here quite nicely," Horner added.

Race winner Hamilton is now one win short of equalling Michael Schumacher's F1 record of 91 career victories.

Bottas' second place finish cost him another eight points to the Briton on the title table to stand 55 points adrift with eight races remaining.

Premier League returns with a bang

Everton oozed class as their three new midfield signings Allan, Abdoulaye Doucouré and James Rodriguez dominated in their 1-0 defeat of Tottenham. Spurs boss Jose Mourinho had an excuse sheet as long as his face post-match although the truth was his side were turgid and one-dimensional.

Chelsea's expensively assembled new project eased past Brighton 3-1 and Wolves looked in total control in their 2-0 win at Sheffield United. Expect the 'Old

Gold' to shine this season.

Elsewhere, Crystal Palace edged past Southampton 1-0. West Ham already look like a club in crisis as Newcastle breezed to a 2-0 victory, and Leicester dispatched newly promoted West Bromich Albion with ease as last season's Golden Boot winner Jamie Vardy scored twice in a 3-0 win.
