huket Governor Narong Woon-

chiew has urged business across the island to hold on until visitors start arriving under the national campaigns to boost domestic tourism in the country.

Speaking at the Governor's House Governor Narong explained. on Monday night (July 20), Governor Narong said that he expected the campaigns to bring Phuket some much welcomed relief as businesses across the island struggle to stay alive.

At least 50,000 visitors are expected to visit Phuket as a result of the campaigns, generating as much as B100 million for the local economy, he added.

"I expect at least 50,000 medical staff from throughout the country to visit Phuket, not including regular people wanting to come to the island,"

"Phuket Public Health Office (PPHO) Chief Dr Thanit Sermkaew is promoting Phuket as a holiday destination to medical staff throughout Thailand, but with a heavy focus on the South and nearby provinces.

"They will come to Phuket, which will help Phuket province. There is no other chance better than this time to travel to Phuket. Phuket is a charming province with good beaches and good food. Also they will explore nature in Phuket, which is now much better," he said.

THE CAMPAIGN

The "We Travel Together" ('Rao Tiew Duay Gun') campaign launched on July 15 under the national government's 'Tiew Pan Suk' ("Travelling

Shares Happiness") initiative.

Medical staffers and volunteers throughout the country can also take advantage of a B2,000 government subsidy for a two-day holiday under the 'Kamlang Jai' campaign as a thank you from the government for their efforts against the spread of COVID-19.

To book government-subsidised holidays under the We Travel Together campaign, registrants must be Thai nationals of at least 18 years of age. They must also have the Krungthai Bank mobile banking app 'Paotang'...



Phuket seeks own COVID rules

■ollowing incidents in Rayong and Bangkok that raised fears of foreigners infected with COVID-19 walking free among the general public, Phuket officials have requested to introduce their own rules to protect the island from any similar incidents.

Key among the concerns was the impact such an incident would have on further damaging the chances of a recovering Phuket's already devastated tourism industry.

The concerns were raised at the meeting of the Phuket Communicable Disease Committee at Phuket Provincial Hall on July 15, chaired by Phuket Vice Governor Phichet Panaphong.

V/Gov Phichet explained that the 43-year-old Egyptian soldier who was later found to be infected had stayed at D Varee Diva Central Rayong hotel from July 8-11.

He went shopping at Passion Mall shopping centre, as locally known as Laem Thong department store, on July 10.

The incident initially caused diplomatic tensions between Thailand and Egypt, with Thai health officials blaming Egyptian diplomats, but further investigation revealed lax screening measures at U-Tapao Rayong Pattaya International Airport.

Prime Minister Prayut Chan-ocha later apologised for the incident

and vowed to step up precautionary measures, while local residents in Rayong blamed the scare for severe harm to its tourism industry.

Over the same days, the daughter of a Sudanese attache was later found to be infected, raising questions about diplomats being allowed into the country without proper screening.

Thousands of people believed to have been exposed to the two cases were tested for the virus. None of the people tested were found to be infected.

At the meeting, Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwansupana shared her concerns such an incident would have. "I am worried about Phuket facing the same situation that just happened in Rayong and Sukhumvit. If there is a second wave of the pandemic [in Phuket], Phuket will suffer worse," Mayor Somjai said.

"I want to ask whether the Phuket Government has better protection measures to handle any such unexpected situations? Will privileged people [sic] be allowed to come to Phuket?" she posed.

V/Gov Phichet responded, "Every person is concerned and does not want the situation in Rayong to happen here, and the Phuket Government and other officials continue to work on enforcing the measures to control and protect against the pandemic.

"For the exemption for privileged people, the Phuket Government is

only allowed to follow orders from the CCSA [Center for the COVID-19 Situation Administration in Bangkok]," he added.

"At this stage, we are waiting for a response to an official request asking whether the Phuket Government can set up our own conditions and regulations for those people or not. However, until then, we must follow the measures set out by the Ministry of Public Health strictly." V/Gov Phichet said.

Meanwhile, the Phuket Public Health Office (PPHO) is offering any persons in Phuket who were in the same areas in Rayong from July 8-11 where the Egyptian soldier, now confirmed as infected, may have visited to come for a free COVID-19 test.

"Anyone who visited Rayong during the same period and are worried whether they had unknown close contact with the infected person, please contact the PPHO and come to be tested for free," said Busaya Jaipiam, Chief of the Phuket office of the Public Relations Department (PR Phuket).

...(on Google Play and App Store) installed on their mobile phone, as every process of campaign - hotel bookings, the issuing of vouchers and the making of payments - is conducted through the app.

The government will pay for 40% of the hotel rooms, but not more than B3,000 per night, limited to five rooms and five nights. Changes to bookings cannot be made after the initial reservation has been confirmed.

CONFIDENCE BOOST

Tourism and Sports Phuket office Director Jaroon Kaewmukdakul on Tuesday (July 21) said he had yet to receive a breakdown of the number of Phuket bookings made through We Travel Together.

However, he also voiced strong confidence that Phuket will benefit. "I expect many domestic tourists to come into Phuket – up to 4,500 visitors a day," he told *The Phuket News*.

"I expect the number of

domestic tourists coming to Phuket to be about double the usual number at this time of year, especially as we have many flights coming to The campaign will also see Phuket, allowing people from all throughout the country to come here," he said.

> Monday alone saw 24 domestic flights land at Phuket International Airport, bringing about 2,000 people to the island, coupled with 25 flights leaving the island, he noted.

> "Right now, there are about 50 flights arriving and departing each day, and I expect more people to arrive by road than by the airport, either with their own cars or by vans and buses," Mr Jaroon added.

"I think Phuket will be among the top-ranking destinations in the country, probably second only after Bangkok. I think Chiang Mai, Chonburi (Pattaya), Rayong and Prachuap Khiri Khan (Hua Hin) will

all rank lower than Phuket," he said...

However, Mr Jaroon noted, "It is still very early days for the campaign. People who are booking their holidays must make arrangements, such as take time off work and prepare their budget. I expect they will start arriving after Aug 1.

"Also, the Mother's Day holiday on Aug 12 is on a Wednesday, so we are expecting many people to take time off for holidays around then."

SLOW START

Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Phuket Office Director Napasorn Kakai on Tuesday confirmed that so far some 2,500 people had booked holiday stays in Phuket through the "Phuket Great Time" campaign, which provides a web portal for all tourism-related businesses to offer discounted hotel rooms, tours and packages.

The campaign launched on June 15, but Ms Napasorn said she had yet to be informed of how much money had been spent through the website as hotel and tour bookings.

"It is difficult to pin down because the booking period is open all the way through until the end of next year," she said.





Cabinet to rule on visa amnesty

mmigration Bureau Chief Pol Lt Gen Sompong Chingduang has announced his plan to extend the visa amnesty for tourists still unable to leave Thailand due to the COVID-19 pandemic from July 31 to Sept 26.

Lt Gen Sompong explained during a visit to Phuket International airport last Friday (July 17) that foreign tourists still stranded in the Kingdom by the COVID-19 pandemic will be allowed to apply for an extended short stay after their visas expire on July 31.

Under the plan, foreign tourists who are unable to leave Thailand would be given a grace period from Aug 1 to Sept 26 to apply to stay for a specified period.

However, if they do not obtain extensions and are still in the country after Sept 26, they would face legal action and be blacklisted, he warned.

Lt Gen Sompong urged foreigners to contact their nearest Immigration office as soon as possible to prepare for their next steps in order to avoid crowding as the Sept 26 deadline approached, reported the *Bangkok Post*.

Foreign visitors must specify their reasons and submit necessary documents when seeking to renew short-term visas, which will be

granted for 30 days, he said.

"If they are unable to return because there are no flights or due to lockdown measures in their countries, they must submit proof. The granting of a short-stay visa will be made on a case-by-case basis," Lt Gen Sompong added.

He said the bureau had asked the Council of State about the proposed

short stay and it had advised that the Interior Ministry could issue an announcement.

He said the Interior Ministry's visa relief measures for foreign visitors would be submitted to the Cabinet for approval on Tuesday this week (July 21). The bureau would later issue guidelines on how to apply for a visa extension.

Lt Gen Sompong said those who planned to return to their home countries did not need to contact the bureau but also had to leave Thailand by Sept 26.

He estimated that between 300,000 and 400,000 foreigners were stranded in the Kingdom due to the lockdown.

The government earlier auto-

matically extended their visas until July 31, but they must still inform authorities where they are staying.

Australian Ambassador to Thailand Allan McKinnon this week confirmed that the Australian Embassy in Bangkok is now providing letters to assist Australian nationals seeking to extend their visas.

"The Australian Ambassador, Allan McKinnon, announced that the Australian Embassy and Consulate-General in Phuket will be issuing visa letters to Australians who require them," Matthew Barclay, Australian Consul-General to Phuket, told *The Phuket News*.

"We understand many people have gone to Immigration to extend their existing visas (or to convert their visas) ahead of the deadline. Many have been informed that they require a letter from their Embassy to do this," he explained.

"It is our intent to ensure that we are not an obstacle in this process. As a result, we will be issuing letters (at no fee and via email) to those Australians who send their passport biodata page to Consular.Bangkok@dfat.gov. au. People should expect a reply within one to two working days," he added.

As always, anyone with queries about their visa circumstances should direct these to Thai Immigration, Mr Barclay advised.

Football coach arrested for two-year overstay

OFFICERS AT IMMIGRAtion Division Region 6 have arrested a Cameroon man working as a coach at a football academy on the island for two-years overstay.

The arrest was made during an ongoing campaign investigating foreigners in Phuket for possible overstay and other breaches of immigration laws, Immigration Division Region 6 Deputy Commander Col Arud Sangjun announced the arrest at a press conference held in Bangkok on July 16.

Col Arud explained that

Mr Ntsando was taken into custody at the football academy, where he was found working, Col Arud said.



Islands to get first support

Phuket, Phi Phi, Samui to be proposed for 'Travel Bubble' plan

inister for Tourism and Sport Phiphat Ratchakitprakarn has confirmed that Phuket is to be one of the pilot destinations to be proposed to the Cabinet to be promoted for "travel bubble" tourists.

Such tourists will be exempt from 14-day quarantines, but will be restricted to visiting specified areas, Mr Phiphat said, reported state news agency National News Bureau of Thailand (NNT).

The three pilot areas to be proposed to Cabinet will be all Southern Thailand provinces: Phuket; Krabi, especially Phi Phi island; and Surat Thani, especially Koh Samui and Koh Phangan islands.

In order to be permitted to join a 'Travel Bubble' tour, foreign tourists must be tested for COVID-19 before coming to Thailand and again when arriving at airports, Mr Phiphat said.



Foreign tourists wanting to stay longer than 14 days will be allowed to visit other areas in the country after staying in their initial destination area for 14 days without exhibiting any signs of infection, he added.

Mr Phiphat also noted that the national domestic tourism campaign, launched through the 'We Travel Together' web portal under the 'Tiew Pan Suk' (Travelling Shares Happiness) government initiative, is expected to "take around a half of the B18 billion budget given by the Cabinet, as most people will not book rooms

that charge the full B3,000 a night."

"We will propose that Phase 2 of this project use the rest of the budget," he added.

"The tourism goal for this year is to generate around 6-7% of GDP, or around B1.23 trillion," Mr Phiphat said

"We expect to generate B700 billion from domestic tourism in the last quarter of this year, and a further B596 billion from foreign tourists," he added.

However, when or whether or not such "travel bubbles" will be permitted was a decision beyond his authority, Mr Phiphat noted.

"That depends on whether the Prime Minister and the Minister of Interior choose people's safety and security or economic recovery," he said

Monsoon brings tide of trash

Volunteers stage cleanup, park chief praises residents efforts

herng Talay Tambon Administration Organisation '(OrBorTor) Chief MaAnn Samran on Monday (July 20) warned people not to visit Bang Tao Beach amid fears people may be injured by broken glass among the slew of trash and debris that washed up onto the beach over last weekend.

"Please do not go to Bang Tao Beach right now. There is too much trash. Please go to Surin Beach instead," Mr MaAnn told The Phuket News.

Already organised to hold a mass cleanup along the beach on Tuesday (July 21) were Cherng Talay OrBorTor officers together with about 30 Russian expats, with the mass cleanup starting at 9am and continuing until midday, he added.

The slew of trash, including plastic, glass fragments, branches and damaged fishing equipment, lies all along the beach, pushed onto the sand by the current strong southwest monsoon weather.

"Trash always washes up on our shores at this time of year," Sirinath National Park chief Natthawat Nuisriram told *The Phuket News*.

"The trash comes from the ocean, but a lot of it is waste that is thrown into the canals by local residents. The canals flow into the sea, and that trash just ends up on our beaches," he added.

"I keep asking local officials to

help prevent this problem, and I am always asking local communities to help keep trash out of the canals," Chief Natthawat said.

Officers have already been tasked with clearing up the trash and debris that has washed ashore

inside the park area, he added, while praising the efforts of volunteers and local residents who just turn up and help to clear the beach of trash during the southwest monsoon months.

"Thank you to all the people

 Thai and foreign – who help by clearing trash from the beaches. The beaches belong to everyone. No single agency can keep the beaches clean alone. It is everyone's responsibility," he said.

Chief Natthawat invited any persons wanting to join park officers during the regular cleanups.

"People wanting to join our beach cleanups can just contact our office and tell the officers that they want to help," he said.

"If need be, people can call me directly on 081-9685725," Chief Natthawat said.

Meanwhile, scores of officials, airport employees and local residents joined together to clear the Nai Yang Beach of trash debris on Monday.

The cleanup, led by Wattanapong Suksai, Director of the Phuket Provincial office of the Ministry of Natural resources and Environment (MNRE), began at 9am.

Joining the cleanup were MNRE officers along with staff and other employees from Phuket International Airport nearby, led by Kriengkai Chanasuk, head of Phuket airport's Safety Division.

island will be closed including the Phuket Immigration Office, Employment Office, Land Transport Office and the island's three District Offices.


All main bank branches will be closed, except branches in shopping centres, which will remain open as normal.

ll of us have items which are valuable, be they expensive items or sentimental ones. We don't want to lose them, which is why we may own a safe, and why we lock our doors. Dogs are no different and many are reluctant to give up a valuable object, whether it's a favourite toy, your favourite shoe or even a tasty piece of eight-day old dead fish from the beach...

Some dogs guard their valuables fiercely enough to hurt anyone who tries to take them away and we call this skill, and the best way to do this is

"resource guarding". It's a natural, normal behaviour as keeping possession of valuables is an important survival skill. If you let someone take your food from you in the wild, you're likely to die. (Much like someone trying to take chocolate from me.)

Still, we sometimes need to take things away from our dogs, especially something harmful such as a cooked chicken bone or a package of rat poison. With resource guarding, we don't want to force or coerce our dogs into anything, as we're likely to make things worse, by being physical, and drawing attention to an item that already holds significant value to the dog.

So teaching our dogs to "leave it" or "drop it" is therefore a very important

teaching them to trade instead. Ergo, we're making it in their interest to give up what they have – which is of value to them, even if it isn't to you - in order to gain something else.

Start by using something your dog already loves such as a ball or favourite tug toy, and engage your dog to play. I normally have the dogs on a leash to begin with, especially if your dog is used to keeping away from you when he has such toys. Encourage your dog to get the toy, either by giving it to him directly, or just throwing it a couple of feet in front of him. Let him enjoy chewing his ball, or playing with his tug toy for a few seconds, maybe even play tug with him if he'll let you.

Then offer him a high value treat in front of his nose so he can sniff it, then wait. At some point, he'll drop the toy and as soon as he does, tell him "Good boy!" and drop a couple of treats a few feet to the side so he can turn to get them.

This is the important part as you want your dog to redirect away from the toy, and re-focus on the treats. It buys you time to bend down and pick up the toy, without him really seeing it. When he finishes the treats and comes back to you, present the toy and tell him to take it. If your dog is quickly eating the treats and racing to get the toy before you can pick it up, then you're likely to reinforce the resource guarding you're trying to prevent. He needs to be engaged in getting his treat, not the toy.

If your dog is super fast, then try using two toys. Whilst my dog has her favourite ball in her mouth, I'll present the second one, and tease her with it – bouncing it a couple of times in front of her. Now her focus changes to the toy that I have, she drops the

ones she has and I immediately roll the second one away for her to chase. Whilst she's getting that ball, I pick up the first one.

At no stage am I asking my dog to do anything - there are no vocal commands. Nor am I trying to grab, or pull the toys away from them. I'm simply waiting for them to make a choice (to drop the object) and then immediately be rewarded - either with a treat, or a second toy. This makes our dogs much more willing to trade, and drop things because they know they will win in the long run.

If your dog isn't interested in the treats, use something of higher value. Some dogs will do this for kibble, others may need something tastier like cheese, or chicken. But once they start to work out you're not trying to steal their resources, they'll quickly co-operate and start dropping toys, because they know another reward is coming.

Once your dog is quickly dropping items, you can wait a couple of seconds before presenting his reward. Over time, you'll see it takes less time for him to return to you with his toy before dropping it, at which point he's worked out the game: "I drop this, and I get rewarded and I get the toy back again!" At this stage, you can now add your "Leave it!" Or "Drop it!" cue.

With its cozy seating, hip soundtrack and beautiful assortment of plants, it's one of my favourite places in Rawai to grab a bite to eat or relax with a piping fresh mug of coffee.

The breakfast and brunch bistro is owned and managed by a young, lovely Thai couple who recently relocated back to Thailand after spending years living in Australia. Foodies at heart, the couple also know good coffee. The compact coffee menu at Home Grain features a lush single original blend, a creamy latte and a delicious Dirty Chai. Plus, it's also possible to get your coffee drinks made with either soy or almond milk.

If coffee isn't what you are after, Home Grain features a variety of gluten-free smoothies and non-dairy drinks. To satisfy your thirst on one of Phuket's hot summer days, I highly recommend you try the Housemade Lemon Lime Bitter. It's the perfect combination of sweet, sour and refreshing. Various homemade treats and pastries are always on offer at Home Grain, which makes the laid-back bistro the perfect place for a chilled coffee or refreshment break.







Can anyone beat Mercedes?

Silver Arrows in total control after opening three-peat

The F1 paddock's burning question, to be clear, isn't whether Mercedes can be beaten to the championship; the question is whether Mercedes can be beaten in a race at all.

Mercedes has clean swept the three grands prixs, with Lewis Hamilton winning twice from pole and Valtteri Bottas once, and excepting opening-round unreliability, the German marque has been almost entirely unimpeachable.

The Hungarian Grand Prix was only another demonstration of superiority. Hamilton and Bottas battled exclusively for pole, and though the Briton only pipped the Finn by 0.1 seconds, the pair was almost a full second quicker than anyone else.

The race was much the same, at least for Hamilton, who mastered the slippery conditions to build a lead so massive that he had time to make an extra pit stop for fresh tyres without losing the lead just to take the bonus point for fastest lap.

Bottas likely would've been nearby had it not been for a dodgy start – the Finn said he was distracted by a light on his dashboard just as



the starting lights were illuminating – but his effortless recovery from seventh up to third, just fractionally behind Max Verstappen, was a practical demonstration of the pace inherent in the Mercedes W11.

So what's happened to the competition?

Red Bull Racing expected to fight for victory at the Hungaroring, a circuit that has typically suited its high-downforce designs, but from practice last Friday (July 17) the team was adrift from the pace and unsure how to correct its direction.

From pre-season testing the car has been precariously balanced, as attested to by both Verstappen and Thai teammate Alex Albon's several spins and slides. In Budapest it was painfully obvious, and upgrades brought to rectify the problem did nothing but exacerbate the team's confusion.

In qualifying it was at its worst, with Verstappen seventh and Albon a lowly 13th.

Both recovered strongly in the race, finishing second and fifth respectively, but it would be naïve to put too much stock in last

Sunday's recovery. Verstappen was no match for Hamilton, and had Bottas had a better getaway, the Dutchman would've finished well behind him rather than 0.75 seconds ahead.

Perhaps in theory the car has the Mercedes-matching pace the team forecast during testing, but there's clearly some way to go to realise it in this compressed season.

As for Ferrari, the less said the better. The Italian team had hoped the twisty Hungaroring would negate its substantial power deficit and move it towards the front. It

proved correct, but that normalised performance was still more than a second off the pace in qualifying and an entire lap down in the race.

Maranello is now considering organisational changes to bolster its technical department to ensure its slump doesn't extend into 2022, when new regulations offer the chance for a reset.

And so Mercedes seems on track for an unprecedented season clean sweep. McLaren lost only one race from 16 in 1988 and Mercedes itself took 19 from 21 in 2016, but never has a team gone undefeated in a campaign.

Can anyone beat Mercedes in 2020? Whatever the answer, you can't help but admire the way the team, almost certainly F1's best ever, continues to raise the bar.

"We're working our arse off, and we're going to continue to do that," the victorious Hamilton said in Hungary.

"Would I like more battle from other teams? Absolutely... But I think it was a pretty flawless effort from the team this weekend. In all areas [we] really delivered.

"I think it was a little bit difficult for sure to compete when you are bringing that 100%," he concluded.

All London FA Cup final

NO MERCY IN UFC TRIUMPH

t has been a long journey from Siberia to UFC glory in Abu Dhabi for Petr Yan but the Phuket-based MMA fighter has finally realised his goal of becoming UFC bantamweight champion.

Yan, whose fighting name is "No Mercy", claimed the vacant UFC bantamweight title after he defeated the legendary Jose Aldo with a fifth-round stoppage in Abu Dhabi on July 12.

The 27-year-old Yan, originally from Yekaterinburg in eastern Russia, has been based at the Tiger Muay Thai & MMA training camp in Chalong for the past six years under the tutelage of coach John Hutchinson.

He contested the vacant bantamweight title with Aldo after the previous holder Henry Cejudo surprisingly announced his retire-

ment following a successful title defense over Dominick Cruz at UFC 249 on May 8.

The fight was relatively evenly contested for the first three rounds before Yan upped his game and turned on the style in the final two

rounds. In the fifth, he held Aldo up against the cage and dropped him with hard punches, including two big uppercuts, before unleashing a ferocious onslaught until referee Leon Roberts stepped in to stop the fight.

Yan landed 194 significant strikes during the bout with Aldo, the most in a single fight in the history of the UFC bantamweight division, including an impressive 62 significant strikes in the final round – more than Aldo had absorbed in his nine previous UFC fights.

'A GOOD KNOCKOUT'

"In the beginning, I wanted to put pressure on him, make him tired and then start attacking after the third round. That's exactly what happened," Yan said post-fight through an interpreter.

"In the first and second round, he had hard punches and low kicks. I waited and pressured him. After the second round, I started to work. It was a good knockout. I liked it," he added.

Yan joins current lightweight champion Khabib Nurmagomedov as only the second Russian fighter to win a UFC title and is now tied for the longest winning streak in UFC bantamweight history. He is targeting Aljamain Sterling for his next fight.

LOST IN TRANSLATION

When Yan first arrived at the Tiger Muay Thai camp in Phuket six years ago there were clear language and communication barriers.

"When we first met he had no English and I had a very thick Irish accent that anyone had trouble with. We actually laughed because we didn't know what we were each saying," coach Hutchinson told *The South China Morning Post*.

"But we didn't need it. I knew from that day this kid was something special. I wrote down in my notes from that day that he'd be world champion and I actually showed him that here in Abu Dhabi to remind him how far he has come."

Those motivational words coupled with tremendous talent and desire to work hard and achieve have fared very well for Yan so far. Although it has been a long road one gets the feeling his real journey is only just beginning.
