DEPUTY PM JURIN URGES PHUKET, PHANG NGA COMMON ENTRY RULES TRAVEL BUBBLE

eputy Prime Minister and Minister of Commerce Jurin Laksanawisit has called for Phuket and Phang Nga to align their

provincial entry requirements so that

tourists may travel freely between the two provinces.

The idea was delivered at a meeting held last Saturday (May 22) at the JW Marriott Phuket Resort & Spa in Mai Khao, attended by 20 representatives of the private sector from Phuket and Phang Nga.

Among those present for the meeting were Thanusak Phungdet, President of the Phuket Chamber of Commerce, along with Nanthasiri

Ronnasiri, Director of the Tourism Authority of Thailand Phuket Office and the President of the Phang Nga Tourist Business Association.

After the meeting, Mr Jurin made a statement to the media explaining that the purpose of his visit was to meet with officials and private sector representatives from both Phuket and Phang Nga "to drive the economy of the Andaman area".

"And at the moment there are two main factors driving the national economy: agriculture and tourism, with factors," he said.

"But the tourism engine is still for COVID Situation Administra-

So there was a meeting today to prepare and implement practical measures to support the plan to open for tourism, especially in Phuket on July 1, this time called Phuket Tourism Sandbox, which will cover the area of Phang Nga as well," he said.

The meeting was held "because there is a need to work together in ways. Andaman cluster tourists who will come to Phuket will also go to Phang Nga," he explained.

"1. Request that the Phuket vaccination management plan is in accordance with the national plan, namely Phuket must have 933,174 doses of vaccination injections provided to 466,587 people in Phuket, thus covering 70% of the total population [of the island]

"2. Ask Phang Nga Province to quickly adjust the plan to accommodate foreign tourists in accordance with Phuket, according to the Phuket Tourism Sandbox on July 1, because the sale of tours or travel plans to foreign tourists should be sold together. Both Phuket and Phang Nga attractions will help attract more tourists to come in the form of the Andaman cluster.



Panic bites over jabs for outsiders

huket officials on Monday (May 24) were scrambling to douse panic rising from people receiving official notices that their appointment to receive a vaccination injection through the government's mass-vaccination campaign had been cancelled.

Through a live video broadcast online just after 7am, Phuket Vice Governor Piyapong Choowong called the move a "temporary suspension".

The key motivation for the upheaval was that certain groups had complained to the Phuket Governor that people from outside Phuket were registering through Phuket Must Win [www.ภูเก็ตต้องชนะ.com] to receive a state-provided vaccine, Vice Governor Piyapong said.

"That may leave people in Phuket not being vaccinated, thus prompting Phuket Province [Phuket Provincial Government] to conduct a review of the information of people who have registered through Phuket Must Win, especially those who do not have a house registration in Phuket, [to check] whether they really work or live in Phuket or not and whether

they have provided accurate and complete information," he added.

"Phuket Province, therefore, postponed the [vaccination injection] appointments of registrants not registered as living in Phuket from May 25 to allow such people to enter the review process and to make it clear that those people are actually working or living in Phuket.

"This may cause inconvenience to people, but I confirm that once you go through the eligibility review process, you will be offered a vaccination appointment next for sure," he said.

"However, those who have received the message to temporarily postpone your vaccination, please hurry and proceed with the steps recommended by 'Phuket Province'," Vice Governor Piyapong urged.

Of the people who have received such messages, people who work in Phuket are to present a formal document from the organisation or business they work for proving that they do so to the district office, local administrative organisation (OrBorTor) or municipality for the relevant area to confirm their right to register through Phuket Must Win, Vice Governor Piyapong explained.

employed person, please coordinate with your village headman in order to certify your right to register, then bring the certified documents to the district office, local administrative organisation (OrBorTor) or municipality to confirm your right to register through Phuket Must Win," he added.

"Phuket vaccinations will continue until June 16," Vice Governor Piyapong assured.

Phuket Governor Narong Woonciew later said that the number of people who were not registered as living in Phuket but had registered to be vaccinated in Phuket numbered as many as 30,000.

Regardless, Governor "In case you are a self- Narong said that suspending registrations while a check was conducted on the legitimacy of those registrations was only prudent. He assured that Phuket had been assigned enough vaccination doses to ensure that 70% of the island's population would be vaccinated in order to allow the July 1 reopening to fully vaccinated foreign tourists.

THE PANIC

The move to suspend some people's vaccination appointments follows officials last Saturday night (May 22) announcing that the 'Phuket Must Win' vaccination registration web portal will no longer accept registrations from Thais from June 5, and no longer receive registrations of foreigners after Tuesday (May 25).

Vice Governor Piyapong on Monday gave no indication when the web portal will resume receiving registrations.

After the announcement last Saturday and V/Gov Piyapong's explanation on Monday, the Official COVID-19 Information Center Phuket, operated by the Ministry of Interior Phuket office posted two clear warnings for people to not provide false information to to officials along with assurances that Phuket residents who have legitimately registered to receive a vaccination injection will be vaccinated.

The centre issued an 'UR-GENT NOTICE' last Sunday afternoon announcing that vaccination appointments had been cancelled for people registered as living outside Phuket, effective from May 25.

The urgent notice called for people to confirm their right to register in the same manner as explained by Vice Governor Piyapong on Monday.

However, the urgent notice also warned that providing false information to officials was an offence under the Criminal Code punishable by up to six months' imprisonment or a fine of up to B10,000, or both. Hours later, the centre issued another notice explaining the process for people to register.

The centre issued another notice at 7am on Monday, this time toning down its message, urging people to follow the steps instructed by Vice Governor Piyapong.

The centre issued yet another notice at 9am Monday, urging people to not panic and follow the instructions given.

MASS VACCINATION PLAN - UPDATED

Called in to join the briefing on Monday to explain the ongoing mass-vaccination plan was Bhummikitti Raktaengam, President of the Phuket Tourist Association, who explained that the plan is to vaccinate people in Phuket in four groups:

Group 1: 417,402 people registered as living in Phuket, minus 106,865 children under 18 years old, leaving 310,537 people to be vaccinated. The province aims to vaccinate 100% of this group.

Group 2: Workers in tourism businesses who are not registered as living in Phuket, 94,100 people (100% vaccination required).

Group 3 Workers in other businesses who are not registered as living in Phuket, 7,500 people (70% to be vaccinated, equivalent to 5,250 people).

Group 4: 80,000 migrant workers (70% to be vaccinated, equivalent to 56,700).

TAT to push Phuket's 'good safety' to lure tourists in the long run

"3. Ask Phuket airport to prepare all aspects to support foriegn tourists arriving in July, which will have direct flights from partner countries that will be open to their national travelling as tourists to Thailand, such as England, Germany and Russia, the United States, Israel, France and Scandinavia. Phuket Airport has to prepare for each scheduled flight, which may arrive at 4am or 5am, or during non-normal working hours. [They must prepare] especially for personnel and the disease control checkpoint.

"4. Phuket Province and Phang Nga Province will make a tourism plan called 'Travel Thailand Together', and when the time is right we will be able to attract tourists to both provinces and make it more convenient for Thai tourists [to come] in accordance with government policy.

"For other provinces in the Andaman group, such as Krabi, we will have a joint meeting in June," Mr Jurin said.

Meanwhile, the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) has come up with a marketing plan to highlight the high level of safety in Phuket and other sandbox areas to gain tourists' confidence despite a spike in new cases.

"As the timeline for the country's reopening via the so-called Phuket sandbox remains the same - July 1 - we have to make sure that the destination, which is currently building herd immunity, is safe for tourists," TAT Governor Yuthasak Supasorn told the *Bangkok Post*.

The TAT on May 19 held a virtual meeting with 50-60 hotel operators led by the Thai Hotels Association, local hoteliers and global hotel companies such as Marriott International, InterContinental Hotels Group, Centara Hotels and Resorts, Minor Hotels, Accor, Dusit Thani, Asset World Corp and Onyx Hospitality Group.

The meeting was to assure operators that the Phuket sandbox will be able to open as planned. The agency

also encouraged hotel operators to play a key role in communicating with international guests to create

"If we cannot give a clear message that the Phuket sandbox is separate from the rest of Thailand, they will not have the confidence to visit the country," Mr Yuthasak said.

He said hoteliers believe that tourists will visit Phuket as they are longing to travel. This situation was seen in Portugal and the Maldives when their borders reopened.

Foreigners to get Sinovac

oreigners in Phuket who have registered through the Phuket Must Win web portal to receive a state-provided COVID-19 vaccination will receive the Sinovac vaccine, and will be vaccinated on one day, this Sunday (May 30), the Phuket office of the Ministry of Interior announced earlier this week.

Foreigners also were given just over 24 hours to choose their preferred venue and time for receiving their vaccination injection.

The news was announced Official COVID-19 Information Center Phuket Facebook page, operated by the Phuket office of the Ministry of Interior, which brands its existence as "to prevent fake news or panic news", at 2:23pm on Monday (May 24).

Of note, the post was in English, and read as follows (verbatim):

If you are foreigners who are legitimately working in Phuket and comply with these following requirements you are eligible for the vaccination (Sinovac vaccine) on 30th May 2021.

- Business Visa / SMART visa
- Work Permit
- Your employer (a person, company or an organisation) must be registered & located in Phuket.

Please contact your employer to register their entity on https://www. xn--12cmj6ba0a7b3g4a6fud5d2a. com/ (ภูเก็ตต้องชนะ) within 25th May 2020. Ask the employer to enrol you and fill in your information on this website. In addition, you must choose the time slot and vaccine center venue within that date as well.

At the time of this report going to press on Tuesday (May 25), no Phuket official had made any public recognition of the announcement despite officials, including the Phuket Provincial Public Health Office (PPHO), previously repeatedly confirming that foreigners will receive their vaccinations in June, after the first shipment of AstraZeneca vaccine doses arrives.

"Vaccination will start from June, and the vaccine to be injected will be AstraZeneca only," the PPHO had previously assured.

The same message was received by foreigners who had been registered in the system.

The move to vaccinate anyone on May 30 also flies in the face of the mass vaccination plan explained by Dr Chalermpong Sukontapol, Director of Vachira Phuket Hospital, just five days earlier.

"During May 18-28, we will give the Sinovac vaccine as the first injection to 200,000 people.

"During June 1-10, we will give Natapanu said. the AstraZeneca vaccine to 150.000 people, including elders who are older than 60 years," he said.

"The last day of mass vaccinations in Phuket will be on June 24. We will have more than 70% of people vaccinated and have achieved herd immunity, so that we can welcome vaccinated tourists," Dr Chalermpong said.

That announcement came during a live broadcast online chaired by Phuket Governor Narong Woonciew.

The announcement last Saturday followed Natapanu Nopakun, Deputy Director-General of the Department of Information and Deputy Spokesman of the Foreign Affairs Ministry, announcing last Friday (May 21) that all expats in the country will be able to register to be vaccinated for COVID-19 at the hospital where their health records are held from June 7 through what the national government is calling "on-site registration".

Mr Natapanu, during his English-language briefing of the COVID situation to the country, opened his address by confirming that the state of emergency had been extended until July 31.

"Thailand attaches importance to the vaccination of everyone in Thailand according to the level of risk, regardless of nationality," Mr

"We practice what we preach. No one is safe in Thailand until everyone is safe, everyone is vaccinated," he said.

"Foreigners will be able to register at the hospitals where you have your own health records by using their passport or social security number," Mr Natapanu explained.

"This is going to be effective across the country," he said.

"Aside from being able to do this at a hospital that already has your health records, it can be done at other designated hospitals, other designated centres as determined by the Ministry of Public Health," he added.

Specifically listed as able to register to be vaccinated on June 7 were foreigners who are spouses of Thai nationals, retirees in Thailand, business people in Thailand and investors in Thailand.

"The expats in Thailand," Mr Natapanu said.

"For each specific group there may be further announcements regarding the details of the location or other specific details as it may be necessary," he added.

"And thank you for your understanding, because this has been something of a challenge in terms of the database and verifying people through documents.

No documents, no boarding

FLIGHT PASSENGERS travelling to Phuket must present documents proving that the passenger is fully vaccinated or has tested negative for COVID-19 within the previous 72 hours or they will not be allowed to board the plane.

The directive was issued by the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand (CAAT) just before 8pm on May 18. The directive came into effect hours later, on May 19.

"Previously, Phuket Province has taken measures to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus with rapid [antigen] tests being conducted at Phuket Airport, but the latest announcement by the [Phuket] Communicable Diseases Committee has canceled the process," the CAAT noted.

"From 19 May 2021 onwards, passengers traveling by airline must present evidence to the airline staff from the originating airport.

> "If [the passenger] is unable to show any evidence, the passenger will be denied travel by the airline." the CAAT ordered.

> The directive also noted that passengers travelling to Phuket must also have the MorChana app installed on their phone and have location sharing enabled on the app at all times for the duration of their stay in Phuket.

> Passengers must also register their travel details through the www.gophuget. com web portal.

"This is in accordance with the resolution of the Phuket Communicable Disceiving two doses of the ease Committee," the CAAT

directive noted.

"And in order to make the passenger's journey to be orderly, the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand requests passengers to check the announcements of the destination province before traveling to be able to comply with the measures of the destination province correctly and facilitate travel.

"They are also asked to strictly adhere to the measures of the Ministry of Public Health to prevent the spread of COVID-19," the CAAT order said.

Of note, Phuket officials made no announcement of the mandatory document checks for flight passengers coming to Phuket following the meeting of the Phuket Communicable Disease Committee at Phuket Provincial Hall on May 17.

Unlike people arriving in Phuket by road, who may serve a 14-day quarantine, or stay in quarantine for their entire stay if their stay is less than 14 days, if they want to come into Phuket (see page 4), so far Phuket officials have not made any announcements regarding allowing people arriving at the airport to enter quarantine after arriving.

huket Vice Governor Piyapong Choowong has responded to a video posted online showing a Thai man furious over being asked to B450 for a rapid antigen test in order to enter Phuket on Monday (May 17).

The man's tirade, which has spread widely over Thai social media sites, came while officials were already continuing to provide tests for B450, despite the provincial order in effect at that time mandating that rapid tests no longer be available.

The man's outburst was over being asked to pay B450 for the test, or else not being allowed to enter Phuket.

Under the previous entry requirements Thais were provided the test for free, while all foreigners were required to pay B500.

"There are no outsiders wanting to come to Phuket, but also people who have their house in Phuket. If they leave the island, they must pay B450 for returning home. What does this mean?

"We pay taxes. You must arrange government medical staff to provide the test and service us. You can have whatever measures you want, but if you hire an outside source and get money from us, it's not right," the man said.

"I'm not a Phuket native, but I have to come to Phuket every month. I also came last month. My friend did have the rapid test for free before, but this time we have to pay B450. Then you see me!

"Don't need to apologise to me. If we see something wrong, we must speak out. We do not blame the staff, but we need to blame the person who set up the measure. The measure is bad like this, we can't accept it!" the

Phuket Vice Governor Piyapong on Tuesday last week explained the new requirements for entering Phuket – and admitted how officers at the checkpoint had continued to provide the rapid tests for B450 each last Sunday and Monday despite the provincial order in effect at that time mandating that the tests were no longer to be made available.

His explanation came only after the cost of the test was supported by

Phuket Governor Narong Woonciew had issued an order that was not posted publicly until 10pm last Monday night (May 17). The new entry requirements officially came into effect on Tuesday (May 18).

Vice Governor Piyapong took to social media again last Thursday (May 20) to repeat his explanation.

"We would like to make our 500,000 people on the island to be safe. Arrivals who come by plane have to be swab tested before getting on board from the departing airport," he said.

"From April 22 to May 15, we had rapid tests for arrivals at the airport and the checkpoint for free because the National Health Security Office [NHSO].

"After two weeks of using rapid test, the NHSO told us to use the test kits in the proactive screening in our provinces instead of testing new arrivals, as the number of people tested positive was very low," he said.

Of note, after testing more than 73,000 arrivals, the rapid tests identified just 18 confirmed cases of infection.

"We planned to not conduct rapid testing at the airport and checkpoint anymore after May 15, but we had practical problems," Vice Governor Piyapong continued.

"On May 16 and 17 we had a lot of arrivals wanting to come to Phuket, especially truck operators. They gathered and asked what to do. They told us they are ready to pay for the test," he said.

"So we asked the medical staff of a private company who were staffing the desks and conducting the tests to continue to conduct the test for arrivals at the lowest price, which was B450.

"The company representative [of the company being paid to conduct the tests] told me they were not happy with the price and that they no longer wanted to conduct the tests at that price any longer," V/Gov Piyapong explained.

"We want to stop the movement of people for a while, but we allow tested and vaccinated people to come because we think they have their own necessary reason," he added.

Kratom suspects caught after 20km police chase

TWO MEN'S ATTEMPT to flee police after a 20-kilometre chase starting in Chalong came to a crunching halt last week when they hit a car head-on in a small

Capt Wichit Nokkaew of the Phuket City Police was called to the scene of the accident, on Soi Paniang, in Moo 5, Rassada, at about 5pm on May 18.

Standing by was the officer who had pursued the two men, with the two suspects in custody: Kitiphop Jongpet, 23, and Anisorn Tuthep, 23, both originally from Phatthalung.

Stopped in the middle of the small street was a grey Phuket-registered Honda City car with a sizable dent in its front. Lying on the road in front of it was a

red motorbike registered in Surat Thani.

Kitiphop and Anisorn had escaped the collision without suffering any injuries.

The officer who had chased the men, who asked not to be named, explained that the pursuit began in Chalong.

He believed the two men

were acting suspiciously and approached them to question them, but the men sped off.

The pursuit lasted some 20 kilometres, he said.

The men ignored the traffic signals and ran red lights at every intersection and went through two underpasses, he added.

Capt Wichit confirmed that Kitiphop was taken to Phuket City Police Station and charged with reckless driving causing damage to other people's property.

Both Kitiphop and Anisorn were to be taken to Chalong Police Station to be charged with possession of a Category 5 drug, Capt Wichit added.

Possession of fresh kratom remains illegal despite a bill being passed by the House of Representatives and later by the Senate in February this year to make possession of the raw plant legal.

Under the bill, processed

remain illegal.

Kratom when ingested acts as a mild stimulant. cocktail 4x100 ("Four times one hundred").

At last report, Justice Minister Somsak Thepsutin in February explained that the Senate speaker was to forward the bill to the House speaker, who would submit it to the Cabinet.

The Cabinet was then to send the legislation to His Majesty the King for final approval.

The bill was to become law 90 days after it had been published in the Royal Gazette.

So far, that has not happened.

Campaign nears B400k for noodle vendor shot by cop

The campaign recently founded by a Phuket expat to help the noodle vendor who was shot and paralysed on Bangla Rd by a drunken off duty policeman has raised almost B400,000 in just one week.

Mr Aroon Thongplab, who is married with two young children, was shot by Cpl Pornthep Channarong on Patong's main nightlife entertainment street in the early hours of Feb 23.

Pornthep's errant shot hit Mr Aroon's spine and subsequently paralysed him. He has been receiving ongoing care in hospital ever since.

Phuket resident Eric Smulders was so moved with the plight of Mr Aroon, 25, that he founded a donation drive in conjunction with AC Legal Advisors to assist him and his family.

The site went live on May 14 and as of last Friday (May 21) had raised B394,907.97 from a total of 50 donations predominantly from the expat community, many of whom chose to remain anonymous.

The only compensation provided to Mr Aroon and his family by the Royal Thai Police thus far is B20,000, received in February. Mr Aroon's wife Kulthida Chananan has sought further assistance but nothing has been forthcoming.

"This man's life and that of his wonder-

ful family have been destroyed and he will need help for a long time," Mr Smulders told The Phuket News on May 14.

"The family needs to rent a larger room as where they currently stay is just too small. They also need to pay for medical supplies, diapers, regular nursing care, and more."

Mr Smulders presently estimates that the family, the couple have one young daughter and a baby boy, will need at least B25,000 per month, much of that just for rent.

BAIL DENIED

Pornthep, who was stripped of his rank and dismissed from the police force following the unprovoked attack, has been

charged with attempted murder, carrying a firearm in a public area without necessary reason, and firing a weapon in a public area.

On Wednesday last week (May 19) he was denied the right to post bail by the Phuket Provincial Court.

"Pornthep told the court that he wanted to be temporarily released so that he could find ways to raise money to provide financial relief to Mr Aroon's family," said Bangkok-based lawyer Kerdphol Kaewkerd, who is providing free legal assistance to Mrs Kulthida.

"He also told the court that he wanted to return guns and other equipment which he kept in his house to the Royal Thai Police. His parents could not find them."

Gold, cash offered for vaccine registration

"To encourage our brothers and sisters in Rawai Subdistrict, we are offering these prizes in order to increase our immunity and keep everyone safe from COVID.

"Phuket will open [to receiving vaccinated foreign tourists] in July, so it is expected that our brothers and sisters will cooperate in being vaccinated," he said.

Rawai Municipality is people working for businesses that are not registered, and will provide a shuttle to the vaccination venue, Mayor Aroon said.

B750mn 'urgent' for new jobs

More than 10,000 recognised as in need of some form of income

he Phuket Governor has requested B750 million from the national government to roll out an urgent employment project across the island in order to help people affected by the ongoing COVID-19 economic crisis.

More than 10,000 people have registered through the Phuket Provincial Administration Organisation (PPAO, or OrBorJor) campaign as unemployed and affected by the economic crisis, Phuket Governor Narong Woonciew told a meeting on May 21.

"Right now, we have 4,551 sensitive people under our assistance," he noted, speaking after a meeting with the Phuket Red Cross, Kusoldharm Foundation and other officials from relevant government agencies.

The Red Cross has handed out what the government calls "survival bags" to local residents three times: 1,933 bags the first time, 1,416 the second time and 1,200 bags the third.

Officers from the three district offices in Phuket started



handing out survival bags on May 21-22, Governor Narong said.

"The Kusoldharm Foundation will provide 2,000 bags to people in Muang district, 1,000 in Kathu and 1,000 in Thalang on May 29 and 30," he added.

"Local administrative offices in each tambon are cooperating with the PPAO to register their people in need. Local administrative offices will support about 50% of the cost for the bags while the other 50% will be from PPAO.

The bags will be provided from June 10 afterward.

"For providing help in July, we have proposed a project to the government to create urgent employment. The project needs B750 million to create employment and pay people the B336 daily minimum wage for six months," Governor Narong said.

"If the project is approved, it will help our people a lot. I'm sure that if 15,000 people [in Phuket] are employed [through the project], we will not need to give them survival bags because they will be able to buy the goods with their own money," he added.

"In addition to the organisations I have mentioned, many other organisations are providing help to our people," Governor Narong recognised.

"One thing that we have discussed but have not included in this meeting is to set up a public kitchen, which will be needed if the situation becomes critical.

"All of us in Phuket will take care of each other, including officials, the private sector Narong said.

"Anyone who does not have essential goods, please contact the Phuket office of the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security, the Red Cross or your local administrative office [OrBor-Tor or municipality]. We have an understanding to help our people together," he said.

The move to ramp up assistance in providing basic food and household essentials to people in need across the island is one of four key elements in the provincial government's strategy to cope with the impact of the latest outbreak of COVID-19, Governor Narong explained.

"We have four issues that we are working on: controlling the infections in the province, protecting the island from infected people from outside, creating herd immunity through vaccination and taking care of those affected by the economic crisis. Each issue is still ongoing," he said.

"For the first issue, for the whole week we have had about zero to five new infected

and the public," Governor cases per day. We need to keep working strictly on our measures. We are trying to keep the number of new cases near zero as much as possible to the end of this month.

> "For the second issue, right now all arrivals by plane must be tested or vaccinated before landing. For land arrivals, those must be fully vaccinated [or have tested negative for the virus]. Right now, being vaccinated has become a passport for travelling," Governor Narong noted.

> "For the third issue, so far, we have provided two injections of vaccine to 100,000 people. In the past three days, we have provided injections to 14,000 people per day, so in total 147,000 people in Phuket have received a vaccination injection.

> "We will keep providing injections to about 15,000 people per day until the end of this month. Next month, we will provide injections to another group of people. In June, we will be able to create herd immunity among about 60-70% people on the island in line with our goal," he said.

Creditors approve restructuring plan over THAI's B116bn debt

THAI AIRWAYS INTERNATIOnal's (THAI) creditors on May 19 formally approved the airline's debt rehabilitation plan which emphasises the state's role in helping the struggling flag carrier access fresh cash injections.

The creditors approved the plan in a vote which had been postponed from last week to allow them to study some last-minute tweaks to the plan.

Twenty-eight out of the 36 groups, representing 13,000 creditors which hold some B116 billion of THAI's debts, casted votes in favour of the plan, after chapters 4, 13 and 15 of the plan were amended.

Chapter 4 of the plan says THAI requires consistent state support

AstraZeneca shots on hold

Second dose to be received 16 weeks after first, instead of 10

The government announced last Monday (May 24) that the second dose of AstraZeneca vaccines will now be administered 16 weeks after the first dose, as opposed to 10 weeks, insisting the delay won't have any negative effect on the immune response against COVID-19.

The move came following reports that several hospitals have suspended inoculations with the AstraZeneca vaccine amid a shortage in Thailand.

It also came on the same day that Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha received his second dose of AstraZeneca vaccine, 10 weeks after his first shot on March 16.

The premier said the nation's vaccine distribution plan might be adjusted according to the pandemic situation in each area and called on people to rely on vaccine information from the Public Health Ministry to prevent confusion.

Permanent secretary for public health, Kiattiphum Wongrajit, reiterated this point, saying the readjusted vaccine remarks after a number of



distribution guidelines are to accommodate the changing outbreak situation in the country, saying the focus now is giving the first dose of COVID-19 vaccines to as many people as possible.

As a result, those who are scheduled to receive their first vaccine in June will now receive their second shot around October, said Dr Kiattiphum, before adding that the government has ordered 3 million vaccines from Sinovac, which will start to arrive next month.

Dr Kiattiphum made the

hospitals announced that they won't be able to administer the second shot of the Astra-Zeneca vaccine to those who have received their first shot in time, stirring speculation that the government is running out of vaccines to meet domestic demand.

A spokesman for the Public Health Ministry, Rungrueng Kitphati, admitted that some areas have run out of the AstraZeneca jabs, while others are quickly running out, as the demand for the vaccine was very high.

Chulabhorn Hospital an-

nounced it will be postponing inoculations with the Astra-Zeneca jabs until it receives more doses, as it only has the Sinovac jabs left in stock.

Similarly, Vachira Hospital (Bangkok) also said it will be suspending vaccinations with the AstraZeneca jabs indefinitely, until more supplies arrive.

'HAVE CONFIDENCE'

Despite the snag, the spokesman urged the public to have confidence in the national vaccine rollout, saying one dose of COVID-19 vaccine alone is

enough to provide protection contract," he said. against new infections, severe symptoms and death.

The second dose, he added, is just a booster intended to prolong the body's immune response against the disease.

Dr Rungrueng said those who have received a dose are not advised to receive the Sinovac vaccine for their second shot, since they were of a different type.

Public Health Minister Anutin Charnvirakul said he is confident that AstraZeneca will deliver its vaccine on schedule in June and confirmed that there would be enough vaccines to inoculate the public against COVID-19 from June 7, when the national rollout is expected to get into full swing.



awasdee Krab... Since COV-ID-19 raised its ugly head in January of 2020 over 164 million cases have been recorded globally and more than 3.41 million lives have been lost. The World Health Organization estimates that the percentage of people who have contracted COVID-19 around the world is around 10%, though that number is a conservative figure as many countries like to save face and do not disclose the actual true figures.

The coronavirus takes no prisoners and the true cost of the pandemic cannot just be measured in just the reported cases and deaths as the economic fallout from all of the world's countries is going to be felt for many years after the pandemic has gone and our children and grandchildren will be the ones who will suffer most financially once the pandemic is over and it will be them who will have to pay for it.

Many countries in the world have seen their economies crash because of the coronavirus; my country of birth the UK as well as Australia, the USA and most countries in Europe have all been hit hard and each of those countries have had to pay out billions of dollars to their citizens to help them get through the crisis due to many of them losing their jobs or businesses during the many lockdowns that were ordered by their governments to try to stop the spread.

If you were lucky enough before you came to live in Thailand, to live in a country where the governments have helped their citizens during the crisis then you may have got through the pandemic virtually unscathed financially, in fact due to the many lockdowns and being forced to stay home you may even be better off financially because you were unable to go out to spend your money in bars and restaurants, buying clothes or going on holidays.

I am one of those lucky people as I receive an Australian/British pension every fortnight and I was also a beneficiary of the Australian government's generous extra payments to help their citizens cope during the pandemic, to the tune of AUS\$1,000 (B25,000) over three instalments in the past year. I recently saw a report from the USA where they said that many people are not even planning on returning to work because the money that they receive in unemployment benefits is more than what they earned when they were working - so that's how good the social system is in the USA, or how bad the social system is if you're an employer looking to hire someone on a wage that is below the money that they are receiving from the US government's unemployment benefits scheme.

Many of us expats came to live in Thailand and made it our home because we love the country and its people and we live a good life here because of the lower cost of living and climate. In my case, I retired five years ago and after trying to live on my pension in Australia for a year I discovered that my pension

was not sufficient to live a decent lifestyle as there was more money going out than coming in and I was dipping into my investment funds too much and Thailand ticked most of the boxes as a retirement destination for me.

Unlike the unemployed in the USA that I mentioned, most of the citizens of Thailand have not had the same help from their government as many expats have had from their home countries and the majority of Thai people have had to go it alone financially. Many of the families who live in Phuket had already been doing it tough for over a year from when the virus first entered Thailand and then at the end of last year, they thought that the coronavirus was lessening its grip on the country and they started to plan again for the future. Then when the second wave started in January and when the third wave arrived, they had to revise their thinking, so there are a lot of Thai people hurting at the present time.

I recently heard about a group of local residents who have united to help the people of Phuket who need help the most due to the pandemic crisis in Phuket. "One Phuket" was started in February this year by a small group of expats and locals to try to help the people of Phuket by organising and delivering food parcels to families who need it most, as many people on the island are now unemployed and do not have enough food to feed their families.

One Phuket is a way for the expats in the group to show their solidarity with the people of Phuket and give something back to the community that has welcomed them with open arms to live on the paradise island of Phuket. This is a very worthy cause and for many of us who have so much compared to our Phuket neighbours it can



be a way to show them that we as expats are not here just to make our own lives better but we care about the people of Phuket and are also part of their community and share their pain.

I am just an ordinary expat pensioner and I do not have a lot compared to some of my compatriots who may have had higher paying jobs with a larger superannuation pay-out or have sold their homes and businesses and retired to the land of smiles with no financial worries, but compared to many of the people of Phuket I am rich. A world of Love and Monsters

hen it comes to the Academy Awards genre flicks rarely get a look in, but this year one found itself on the nominations list and it raised eyebrows everywhere. 'Love and Monsters' was the little film that found itself boxing well and truly out of its weight division.

An American/Australian co-production Love and Monsters found itself amongst the heavy hitters when it was nominated in the Best Achievement in Visual Effects category, it didn't win but it did suddenly have the world asking, "What on earth is that film?" Well to answer that question the film has now been made available on streaming platforms right around the world.

Directed by Michael Matthews (Five Fingers For Marseilles), Love And Monsters is set in a world that was saved by nuclear weapons when a meteorite threatened the Earth's existence but the resulting fallout caused every cold blooded creature to mutate into gigantic 'monster' versions of themselves.

These creatures then killed a majority of the human population and the human's left, which include the very innocent Joel (Dylan O'Brien – The Maze Runner), are left to live in colonies hiding underground. While he is a nice guy, Joel freezes when he comes faceto-face with danger and as a result his



colony sees him as a liability. While the others go out to hunt he is left to stay behind and cook, and while the rest of the members of his colony have paired off, Joel finds himself alone lost in his own thoughts.

However, after making radio contact with the girl, Aimee (Jessica Henwick – Game of Thrones), that he was in love with before the world went to hell, he decides that he is going to make the dangerous journey from his colony to hers.

As a film *Love and Monsters* has the feel of Zombieland all over it. You've got the 'weak' main character, a world that he doesn't fit in with, and for good measure the inclusion of a grumpy ally, Clyde (Michael Rooker - Guardians of the Galaxy), who actually cares a lot

more than he is letting on. Like Zombieland the film also has an injection of humour that isn't enough to destroy the fantasy element of the film but is just enough to provide you with a laugh here and there.

The key to this film working though are the characters. Joel is a likable guy and the audience soon warm to him and want to see him succeed – due largely to the fact most audiences will realise that Joel is exactly what they would be like in the middle of the apocalypse. Add in a cute dog called Boy and a trusty side-kick, Minnow (Ariana Greenblatt - Avengers: Infinity War), and you soon have a group of characters that nobody wants to see anything bad happen to.

The inclusion of the other-worldly

creatures does give a Stranger Things vibe throughout the film while the screenwriting team do just enough to create scenes with heart, like Joel bonding with a robot, to go alongside the action sequences. To their credit those action sequences and creature effects look pretty stunning, especially when you realise the film was made for the same sum as some film's catering budgets. This is a filmmaking team that have a huge future ahead of them.

Just like he did in The Maze Runner franchise, Dylan O'Brien once again shows Hollywood what he has to offer with his role here. He is brilliant throughout this film and whether it comes to an emotional scene or an action sequence, he is the kind of actor that can shine through both.

Love and Monsters is one of the biggest surprises of 2021. It certainly deserved its Oscar nomination and you get the feeling that this film will become a family favourite for the younger generation in the same way films like The NeverEnding Story and Labyrinth had for generations in the past.







Verstappen cruises in Monaco

Red Bull driver does his talking on the track to grab season lead

ax Verstappen currently leads the drivers championship for the first time in his F1 career to finally make good on Red Bull Racing's (RBR) early-season pace.

RBR and Verstappen arrived in Monte Carlo as favourites to win the Monaco Grand Prix, but not even they could have envisaged the damage they'd deal to Mercedes.

While Verstappen cruised to an easy victory last Sunday (May 23) after leading every lap, Lewis Hamilton struggled to seventh. The result was a dramatic swing in the championships standings, with Verstappen now leading Hamilton by four points and Red Bull Racing leading Mercedes by just one.

Strange though it may seem to say given the closeness of the tallies and the earliness of the season, this was a mustwin race for Verstappen. The Dutchman has had a faster car

for much of the year but has seen chances slip through his fingers through some on-track mistakes and poor strategy, while Mercedes has maximised its opportunities as it has learnt to unlock the latent pace of its capricious car.

The previous round, a dominant Hamilton win at the Spanish Grand Prix, suggested Mercedes was poised to stretch its championship advantage.

"I think they still have performance on us," he opined to British TV at the previous race in Barcelona. "They're just making a lot of mistakes."

It was perhaps the first minor missive in a campaign sure to be fought as hard off the track as it is on it, and Hamilton fired another volley when F1 landed in Monaco in an attempt to dominate the psychological front and ratchet up the pressure.

"Perhaps, as you know, he feels that he has a lot to prove," he said of Verstappen's ontrack aggression this season.

"But I am not necessarily in the same boat there, and I am more long term. It's a marathon, not a sprint, sort of mentality, which is ultimately why I have the stats that I have."

HOLLOW WORDS But stones are best not thrown in glass houses, and Hamilton's weekend-long difficulties ensured his words rung hollow by Sunday evening.

Not only did the reigning champion struggle with his car's propensity to underwork its tyres around the low-energy city streets, but his team seemingly ignored is unlikely to prove a turning his suggestions to ameliorate his problems through set-up changes, leaving him seventh on the grid at a circuit around which overtaking is almost impossible.

His strategy was commensurately woeful, losing him two places he got back only due to the retirements of other drivers – one of which was teammate Valtteri Bottas, for whom the misapplication of a wheel gun blunted one of his wheel nuts, leaving his tyres unable to be changed in a bizarre turn of event.

The collapse was as spectacular as it was ironic, and after a serene cruise to victory, Verstappen's post-race summation was blunt.

"Actions always speak louder than words," he said. "I think that's a good lesson after this weekend - you have to talk on the track.

"Yes, we as a team so far have made the smallest mistakes, and that's why we are ahead. So I hope we can keep that going for the rest of the season."

The Monaco Grand Prix point in the title campaign. The circuit is the sport's greatest outlier in terms of demands on the car, and Mercedes always bounces back strongly from these howler weekends it has an odd propensity to commit once or twice a year.

But it was a reminder that this championship is liable to be defined by a team and driver's worst weekends as much as it is by moments of brilliance. Hamilton still has more wins, but Verstappen has yet to finish lower than second in 2021, and his mastery of his off days has won him a four-point advantage.

There's still so long to go in this season of recordbreaking length, but words will count for nothing at the end of it.

US warns against Olympic travel

OLYMPICS

THE UNITED STATES last Monday (May 24) warned its citizens not to travel to Olympic host Japan, citing the growing risk of the COVID-19 pandemic in the Asian nation just two months before the Games begin.

The warning came in a travel advisory issued by the State Department despite Japan opening its first mass vaccination centres in a push ahead of the Games.

The decision was based

primarily on government health advice, as well as "secondary factors such as commercial flight availability, restrictions on US citizen entry, and impediments to obtaining COVID test results within three calendar days," the advisory

Just 2% of Japan's population of 125 million has been fully vaccinated so far and a recent surge in infections has put hospitals under strain with Tokyo, Osaka and eight other regions under a state of emergency.

The majority of athletes and others staying in the Olympic village will be vaccinated before they enter Japan, but inoculation is not required to participate. AFP

'Lefty' secures epic PGA win

PHIL MICKELSON BEcame the oldest major winner in golf history last Sunday (May 23), the 50-year-old left-hander capturing the PGA Championship by two strokes for his sixth and most iconic major title.

The age-defying American took the US\$2.1 million (B66mn) top prize with an epic victory for the ages, producing a dazzling display at windy Kiawah Island while younger rivals faded.

Mickelson erased the major age win mark set by American Julius Boros when he captured the 1968 PGA Championship at age 48.

Mickelson ground out a final-round one-over par 73 to finish 72 holes on sixunder 282 with South Africa's Louis Oosthuizen and American Brooks Koepka sharing second on 284.

It was the first major victory for Mickelson since the 2013 British Open.

The crowd, limited to 10,000 people by COVID-19 safety measures, roared with every successful swing by

On the front nine, Mickelson answered three bogeys with three birdies in a roller-coaster start, his most astonishing effort a 50-foot chip-in from the sand at the par-3 sixth, for a two-stroke lead at the turn.

World number 115 Mickelson sank a 12-foot birdie putt at the 10th while Koepka and Oosthuizen made bogeys to leave "Lefty" with a fourstroke edge.

Spectators created a surreal scene at the 18th hole, swarming around Mickelson after his second shot as he tried to walk to the 18th green,

Mickelson, creating an elec-needing to three-putt from

Outnumbered security the longest layout in major guards forced Mickelson history at 7,876 yards. through a throng of thousands of people who encircled the green chanting "Lefty, Lefty," and roared with delight as he tapped in for par to complete a victory for the ages.

> "It has been an incredible day," Mickelson said. "Certainly one of the moments I'll cherish my entire life. I hope others find that inspirational."

Final day of Premier drama

Chelsea and Liverpool edge top four as Leicester miss out again

iverpool and Chelsea seized the final two Champions League places in a dramatic end to the Premier League season last Sunday (May 23), leaving Leicester heartbroken for the second consecutive campaign.

With Manchester City already guaranteed a third title in four years and Manchester United certain to finish second, the focus was on the battle for the remaining two places in the top four.

Heading into the 38th and last round of fixtures, just one point separated Chelsea in third place from Leicester in fifth.

Two Sadio Mane goals gave Liverpool a 2-0 win at home to Crystal Palace, while Thomas Tuchel's Chelsea were indebted to a late Leicester collapse against Tottenham at the King Power Stadium.

Chelsea lost 2-1 at Aston Villa but were saved by the 4-2 defeat for Brendan Rodgers' FA Cup winners.

Liverpool had to celebrate the club's first league triumph for 30 years in an empty stadium last season and their Premier League title defence was blown off course by a series of injuries to key players.

But they avoided the financial hit of missing out on Europe's top club competition by finding their form in the final months of the season, winning eight of their last 10 games to finish third.

"Outstanding, best I could've dreamt of – we wanted this feeling, this game, this atmosphere," Jurgen Klopp told the BBC after the win in front of 10,000 fans.

"Finishing the season in third is incredible, I can't believe it – credit to the boys. I can't believe how it worked out in the last few weeks, incredible."

Chelsea were on the brink of missing out on a top-four finish, trailing at Villa Park as goals from Bertrand Traore and Anwar El Ghazi put the home side 2-0 up.

Ben Chilwell pulled a goal back, but in the end Chelsea were saved by the Leicester result to finish fourth, meaning they can now focus on next weekend's Champions League final against Manchester City

knowing they are in the comished one ahead of Liverpool's petition next season.

LEICESTER PAIN

Leicester were left to dwell on another agonising near-miss, just a week after winning the FA Cup for the first time in their history.

The Foxes, forced to settle for a Europa League spot, also missed out on the top four on the final day of last season when they were beaten by Manchester United.

Leicester ended with more days in the Premier League's top four than any other side this season, adding to their sense of frustration.

They appeared to be on the brink of a stunning end to their campaign as two Jamie Vardy penalties saw them lead 2-1 with 16 minutes to go, but a Kasper Schmeichel own goal and two late Gareth Bale strikes completed a turnaround for Spurs.

Harry Kane was also on the scoresheet in potentially his final match for Spurs to win his third Golden Boot award.

Mohamed Salah on 23 goals and also picked up the prize for most assists in the season with 14.

"It's hugely disappointing for us," said Rodgers. "We fought so hard all season. I always said you're judged after 38 games and unfortunately we couldn't quite make it."

West Ham secured a Europa League spot by beating Southampton 3-0 while Fulham, West Brom and Sheffield United had already been relegated.

Tottenham finished seventh to take a Europa Conference League spot.

Sergio Aguero scored two goals on his final home appearance for Manchester City in their 5-0 romp against Everton after coming on as a secondhalf substitute.

Pep Guardiola's side, who finished 12 points ahead of Manchester United, celebrated with the Premier League trophy after the match.

The club also paid tribute to Aguero, whose 184 Premier League goals are the most by The England captain fin- any player for a single club.

Maradona doctors face murder charge

SEVEN PEOPLE UNDER investigation over the November death of Argentine footballing legend Diego Maradona face charges of premeditated murder, a judicial source has confirmed.

The accused – which include Maradona's neurosurgeon Leopoldo Luque, psychiatrist Agustina Cosachov and psychologist Carlos Diaz – face eight to 25 years in prison if found guilty.

The indictment is based on findings by a board of experts into Maradona's death from a heart attack last year, a source from the San Isidro Attorney General's office, which is leading the investigation, said last Thursday (May 20).

That report concluded that the footballing icon received inadequate medical care and was left to his fate for a "prolonged, agonising period" before his death, which came just weeks after undergoing brain surgery on a blood clot.

"After so many injustices, the case has come full



circle," the source told *AFP*.

The accused are prohibited from leaving the country and must appear ahead of an inquiry between May 31 and June 14.

were prompted by a complaint filed by two of Maradona's five daughters against Luque, who they blamed for their father's deteriorating condition after the brain surgery.

Prosecutors believe Maradona's death was not the result of malpractice or negligent actions of his doctors, but that they knew the former soccer star would die and did nothing to prevent it.

The prosecutors obtained a series of messages and audio that show that the medical team were aware that Maradona was using

alcohol, psychiatric medication and marijuana in the last months of his life.

Among the conclusions of the report, the medical board said that "the signs The legal proceedings of life risk" shown by the former Naples and Barcelona star were ignored, and that his care in his final weeks was "plagued by deficiencies and irregularities".

> The recriminations and accusations over Maradona's death are taking place alongside another case, over his disputed inheritance, involving his five children, his brothers and Matias Morla, his former lawyer.

Maradona is an idol to millions of Argentines after he inspired the South American country to only their second World Cup triumph in 1986. AFP
