CAUTION VITAL AS PHUKET BECOMES TESTBED FOR INTERNATIONAL TOURISTS

afety is the key priority in opening Phuket to receive 'travel bubble' tourists from Oct 1 under the government policy 'Safe and Sealed', the Director of the Ministry of Tourism and Sports (MoTS) Phuket Office, Jaroon Kaewmukdakul, told The Phuket News this week.

Tourism and Sports Minister Phiphat Ratchakitprakan confirmed the news in Bangkok late last week that Phuket would be the first province in the country to receive international tourists under the plan. The protocols to be deployed in Phuket have been to be used elsewhere throughout Thailand if proved successful.

Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Governor Yuthasak Supasorn admitted to international media that opening the island to foreign tourists brought risk of exposing the country to COVID-19 infections.

"There is a risk in the new tourism model, but if we don't open there is a bigger risk for the economy," he said.

Any tourists arriving under the plan must spend their first 14 days at an approved Alternative Local State Quarantine (ALSQ) hotel. "After that they can go anywhere on the island," MoTS Phuket Director Mr Jaroon explained.

Tourists will be tested on landing dubbed the "Phuket Model" and are and again at the end of their 14-day quarantine. "If they want to visit

any other parts of the country, they will have to stay at their ALSQ for a further seven days and be tested again before they will be permitted to leave the island," he said.

However, Mr Jaroon quickly added, "The protocols to be followed have not yet been confirmed. That will not happen until senior officials from the MoTs and the Ministry of Public Health have inspected the island. That is expected to happen in September."

All final decisions will be made by the Centre for COVID-19 Situation Mr Jaroon noted, including whether tourists will be allowed to move freely within a one-kilometre radius of their hotel or even visit a segregated area

on a nearby beach, as proposed by Minister Phiphat last week.

"We are also waiting for the CCSA to announce what rules we are to apply, and we have to wait for the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand [CAAT] to announce that Thailand will again be open to receiving international passenger flights. We have yet to hear any details regarding this," he said.

Mr Jaroon explained that as of Monday (Aug 24) many details had yet to be fleshed out, but the basic plan is not to try to re-ignite the Administration (CCSA) in Bangkok, short-stay mass tourism market, but instead target long-stay tourists who spend the northern hemisphere winter months is much-warmer Thailand.

"We expect these long-stay...

...tourists to stay in the country anywhere from 30 to 90 days," he said.

Such foreigners are expected to arrive on charter flights, which are more easily controlled, Mr Jaroon said.

"Also, after the foreigners have completed their 14-day quarantine, they can stay at any other accommodation they prefer," he added.

Mr Jaroon admitted that at this stage he did not know which countries would be targeted with marketing campaigns, but assured, "Only tourists from countries that are deemed safe will be chosen."

STUCK FOR CHOICE

Mr Jaroon noted that so far only two hotels on the island had been approved as ALSQ venues, despite 55 tourist accommodation venues guests visiting or staying at the hotel. applying for the privilege.

"These hotels are big hotels and there are only 22 medical teams in the country empowered to inspect and approve ALSQ venues, and each hotel must be partnered with a hospital as part of the process," he said.

"Also big hotels have more staff, which means more people will have jobs by these hotels being open. And as staff serving ALSQ quests will have to remain at the hotel, they will not be permitted to transit back and forth from home to work, "We are focussing on having the the big hotels have accommodation

where their own staff can safely stay," he added.

However, how the hotels are to abiding by strict health regulations attract tourists to want to stay at their establishments will be solely up to the hotel managers themselves.

"The tourists will be staying at the hotel for at least 14 days, so the hotels will need to offer something to attract guests. Whatever the hotel wants to create - food buffets, entertainment and wellness activities - that is all up to the hotel to create its own marketing plan to reach their target market," Mr Jaroon said.

Mr Jaroon admitted that the news had spurred mixed reaction among the public, from open support for the move to many people voicing their fears that re-opening to tourism will spark a COVID-19 outbreak on the island.

"That is up to Phuket Governor Narong Woonciew to communicate with the Phuket people, so they understand what is being done and to unite us together.

"But whatever we do with this, we need safety to be our first priority for Phuket province," he added.

CONTAINMENT

Phuket Tourist Association President Bhummikitti Ruktaengam this week defended the move to reopen the island to tourists, and voiced his strong support for the 14-day quarantine required after landing.

He also pointed out that proposal made to Royal Thai Army Deputy Commander-in-Chief Gen Natthapol Nakpanit – who also serves as the chairman of the CCSA's ad hoc committee to consider easing the enforcement of measures to prevent

the spread of COVID-19 – was not made by the hotel industry alone during his visit to the island on Aug 13.

The move was supported by no less than 12 industry representatives on the island, he said.

"Only if there are clear steps, details, conditions and processes that are thoughtful and clear, will we agree [to receive foreign tourists]," Mr Bhummikitti added.


"There is no way for us to agree to any model that cannot ensure people's safety. The details have yet to be announced. We are hoping to hear more explanations this coming week," he said.

"We are confident that the tourists will not go home on the 15th day of their stay. I think they will keep travelling in Phuket province, and that will be better for our economy.

"Also, I expect this to start slowly, with the first group of tourists to arrive in Phuket being only a small group.

"Then Phuket people can learn and adjust to the new processes, and the number of tourists coming can grow slowly and safely," he added.







Police probe student's death

Senior student charged over cheerleading practice punishment

student at Phuket Rajabhat University is facing a charge of negligence causing death following the death of 20-year-old first-year student Pornpiphat "Mint" Iaddam at the campus north of Phuket Town last Wednesday (Aug 19).

"Police are also investigating whether any other persons are to be held accountable," deputy national police chief Pol Maj Gen Suchart Theerasawat announced at Phuket City Police Station on Monday (Aug 24).

Maj Gen Suchart had flown to Phuket to be updated in person about the case, which had gained national attention. Present at the meeting this afternoon were Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pol Maj Gen Rungrote Thakurapunyasiri, Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commanders Col Witoon Kongsudjai and Pol Col Arayaphan Phukbuakhao, Phuket City Police Chief Col Teerawat Liamsuwan and the team of police officers

tasked with investigating Nong Mint's death.

Nong Mint, a Phuket native, was enrolled in the Bachelor of Arts Thai-language program under the Faculty of Humanities. She began her studies at the campus in June. She collapsed while running during a training session with the cheerleading squad, led by senior students, at the campus. She was rushed to hospital by friends, but was pronounced dead soon after arrival.

The university has repeatedly announced through public statements that Nong Mint's death was not the result of any hazing of first-year students, despite confirmed reports that the first-year students in the cheerleading squad were singled out for "extra exercise" for making mistakes during practice.

Initial reports in the media consistently reported that Nong Mint collapsed after completing five of eight laps around the campus pond, as ordered by a senior in the cheerleading squad. Each lap of the pond is about one kilometre long.

However, a student last Sunday told the press the same series of events that matched the university's public statement, that Nong Mint collapsed after only a few hundred metres while completing several laps around the car park area where the cheerleading practice was being held. Maj Gen Suchart on Monday said that this particular factor was being investigated thoroughly by police.

"There are no CCTV cameras covering the area in question [where Nong Mint collapsed]. There are CCTV cameras inside the building, but they do not cover the area in question," he said.

Students, especially those involved in the cheerleading practice, as well as doctors, had already co-operated with police and given witness statements, he said.

"We cannot reveal what they said in their statements as the investigation is still ongoing," he said.

The statements did include testimonies about what activities were ordered and how far the students were ordered to run, he added.

"Now there is evidence to report that one female senior student has been charged with negligence resulting in the death of another person," Maj Gen Suchart said.

The student had already surrendered to investigating officers, but had denied any negligent action, he noted.

"Whether the person will be allowed temporary release is at the discretion of the investigation officers," he added.

Other people are also under investigation for their possible action or inaction that may have led to Nong Mint's death, Maj Gen Suchart added.

"At this stage, we do not know how many people it will be as the results of the medical examination are not finished and the questioning of the relevant students and faculty members is not yet complete," he said.

Maj Gen Suchart cautioned all people against making presumptions about the case.

"It is the right of each person to testify, and the investigating officers must act in accordance with the law to determine whether the issues of forcefulness and negligence led to the death or injury of another person," he said.

"This investigation requires subtlety. The person had no intention of [Nong Mint] dying, but there is the question of whether it was a reckless act and whether or not proper first aid was provided," he added.

Scores turn out for Job Fair

The concourse at the Baan & Beyond shopping mall on the bypass road was bustling with job seekers last Thursday (Aug 20) as the Phuket Employment Office held its Phuket Job Fair 2020.

More than 1,200 job vacancies were available at the event, where people seeking work and potential employers could discuss job opportunities with each other in person, explained Santi Nantasuwan, Chief of the Phuket Provincial Employment Office (PPEO).

The aim of the event was to accelerate the [economic] recovery, to stimulate the local economy and promote employment in the area, Mr Santi said.

The job vacancies promoted at the event were not only in Phuket, he added. Employers present offered jobs in the neighbouring provinces of Phang Nga and Krabi, and as far away as Ranong, Surat Thani, Nakhon Sri Thammarat and Songkhla provinces.

Applicants at the event could even register their availability to work abroad, he said.

"The COVID-19 situation has had a serious economic impact. Businesses across Phuket have had to shut down and lay off workers. Most recently, more than 20,000 workers have registered that they lost their jobs due to such problems," said Phuket Vice Governor Supoj Rotreuang Na Nongkhai, present to officiate the opening of the event.

Events such as the job fair were much welcomed, he added.

"To help people left unemployed by the COVID crisis, ing to the problem of the

departments under the Ministry of Labour are working with business operators so they can offer any job vacancies directly to those seeking work," V/Gov Supoj said.

Mr Santi pointed out that the relevant officials were present at the job fair to provide advice about labour law in terms of dismissal or forced resignation, and for obtaining government benefits.

Times are tough in the job market, Mr Santi admitted, and the annual influx of new graduates entering the world of work for the first time this month are addcurrent economic situation.

Mr Santi urged any people seeking work to register with the PPEO.

"People can even register online through the Phuket Employment Office website. Their information will be entered in the Department of Employment national database, which has more than 50,000 positions available all across the country," Mr Santi explained.

"This will help us to match any registrants with positions being offered by employers, and we can help applicants to call the employer for an interview," he added.







Victims hold curse ritual as molester roams free

ngered by a lack of police action after two years, victims and family members of victims of sexual assault and attempted rape in Bara Para, Pa Khlok, held a ceremony last week to curse a man in the village accused of at least 20 counts of sex assault acts with children as young as 5 years old and minors up to 18 years old.

The ceremony, which included the burning of salt and chilies in a pan and the burning of a curse written on paper, was held at the Tha Sak Community Hall in Baan Para on Aug 19.

The man accused, who they referred to only as "Khai", is still seen walking around the village, the women said.

Khai was released on bail after one complaint was taken seriously by police, but has remained free for the past two years, the women added.

A 17-year-old girl at the ritual who asked reporters to call her "Ann" (not her real name) said that after her mother died, her father left her with her aunt's family. However, there was no space in the house, and she had to find somewhere else to stay.

A friend introduced her to Khai, who later invited her to stay at his house, and he promised to give her some money. After Ann moved in, Khai forced her to help him masturbate, prompting her to flee



the house as soon as it was safe, she said. Later, when she returned to get her be-

longings, Khai tried to rape her, Ann added. She managed to flee by kicking him, and went to Thalang Police Station, but police did not accept her complaint as she had no guardian to sign her complaint as a witness, Ann explained.

Also at the ritual, Chuanpit Ruengdet, 73, said that her granddaughters were molested by Khai two years ago. The children were 8 and 5 years old at the time.

Ms Chuanpit explained that at that time her daughter Sontaya, 20, visited her and let her children play together in front of their house next door.

Later when Sontaya came home, she saw her daughters with Khai, who immediately ran away. Then the daughters told Sontaya that Khai had touched their genitalia and he had threatened to kill them if they told anyone, Ms Chuanpit said.

Ms Chuanpit also explained that the ceremony was held because Khai today remains free on bail, and is still walking around the village.

"We all hope that the relevant legal officers will deliver justice and send Khai to jail," Ms Chuanpit said.

"We already went to Phuket Provincial Hall and talked to a Deputy Governor, who told us that we have to let police do their work and follow the legal process," she added.

"If we do not see any progress, we will report this to the Pavena Foundation for Children and Women," Ms Chuanpit said.

Tsunami evacuation drill to be held in Kamala

A TSUNAMI-EVACUATION drill will be held in Kamala next month, with the tsunamiwarning sirens sounding the alarm at 9am on Sept 9.

The drill is part of a series of tsunami-evacuation exercises being held throughout all six Andaman coast provinces, explained an advisory from the headquarters of the national Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM) in Bangkok.

The series of tsunamievacuation drills were conducted in Ranong, Phang Nga and Krabi, on Monday and Tuesday (Aug 24-25), and will be held in Phuket, Trang and Satun on Sept 8-9.

The evacuation exercise in Kamala will take place at Rajaprajanugroh 36 School, in Soi Rimhaad, Moo 3, and will last three hours, from 9am to 11am, the DDPM-Phuket advisory noted.

Similar tsunami-evacuation drills were held in Baan Talay Nok in Ranong, at Baan Nam Khem in Takuapa and Baan Tha Payoi in Kuraburi of Phang Nga, and at Baan Laem Kruad in Krabi from 9am to 11am on Tuesday (Aug 25).

On the same days that Phuket will hold its exercise,

evacuation drills will take place at Baan Laem Makham in Trang and Baan Haadsai Yao School in Satun.

The first day of the twoday exercises is dedicated to training community leaders and local administration officers in how to conduct the drills, with the evacuation exercises being held on the second day, the DDPM notice explained.

Local officials will publicise details of the evacuation drills closer to the dates, the notice added.

"Those living in the evacuation drill areas, please do not panic and feel free to join the evacuation drills at the set locations and times," the DDPM said in its notice.

'New Mutants' breaks curse, hits the big screens

ike a sleeping giant coming out of hibernation, the cinematic world is finally starting to awake from its slumber. Some countries, including Thailand, have had their cinemas open for a few weeks now. Other countries including Australia and the United States have some cinemas open while others remain closed in lockdown areas.

The cinemas that have already opened have been drip-fed smallerrelease films while Russell Crowe's Unhinged being the first film with a notable star at the helm to make its way into cinemas. Of course that all changes next week with Christopher Nolan's Tenet hitting cinemas, but while all the focus has been on the Nolan epic the film that has had many comic book fans is the eventual arrival of the latest film in The X-Men franchise, The New *Mutants*, which also opens in selected cinemas on August 28.

The film has had a rocky past. It was originally slated for release in 2018 but then got held up by Disney's takeover of Twentieth Century Fox and then

had a COVID-19 date change as well. But finally the film lands next week and comic book fans right around the world can take a massive sigh of relief.

Of course one of those fans is the film's director, Josh Boone, whose love of the X-Men inspired him to want to make the film. "I finished making The Fault In Our Stars for Fox and I knew that they had the X-Men franchise which I had loved since I was a kid," Boone told the audience at the recent Comic-Con At Home fan event.

"My best friend and I had loved this 'Demon Bear' saga that they had done with the comics because it kind of mixed genres a little with dark fantasy. horror and superhero comics, which I had never really seen anything like that before and it looked so different to anything I had seen in the indie comics that I had been reading for years."

Certainly the trailer for *The New Mutants* hints that Boone has captured that crossover of genres very well with the film, with many people commenting on the fact that the trailer shows the film's true horror side and that is something that Boone had dreamed about bringing to the screen even before he was a filmmaker.



"I remember sitting in my apartment in LA before I was even making films and I had a stack of New Mutant comics there," he continues. "And I was like 'one day maybe' but it really wasn't working out. But I really thought it would eventually, and ultimately it was the mixing of all those genres that really made this something that I wanted to do."

Of course one of the other reasons that fans are so excited about being able to finally see *The New Mutants* is because they are dying to see Game Of Thrones favourite Maisie Williams in one of the first big roles outside of the series that made her famous.

"I was just so excited," Williams says when asked about what it was like stepping into a new franchise and getting to play a character as quiet and reserved as Rahne Sinclair.

"I was really thrilled to be able to play someone like Rahne because I have always seen myself as that kind of character.

"I think she is very uncomfortable in her own skin," she says delving deeper into her character. "She wants to speak up and say how she feels but

she is constantly treading lightly.

"You know when I played Arya Stark I always had to be so commanding and own the room. I had to be brave and strong and that is kind of exhausting and I don't feel like doing that all the time. So it was actually really lovely being able to play Rahne, who is really just sitting, watching and listening, and she only really comes to life when she is with Danni – but in the group she is much quieter and keeps to herself...

"And I mean the whole X-Men fanbase have just been incredible, or I guess the New Mutants family, if they are the same thing. They have been really welcoming though and I guess this whole superhero world is totally bonkers but I am glad to be back again," she said.

The New Mutants opens in Phuket cinemas on August 28. The film has yet to be classified.

Getting the 9th Degree



THE CULINARY DETECTIVE

or those of you who read my culinary column, you will be aware that I was fortunate to visit the 9th Floor in Patong, a legend, not only in terms of quality cuisine but also in its success in what is an undoubtedly far from salubrious part of town, more celebrated for alternative fleshy temptations to the signature boneless Angus short rib available at the former. During my dinner, whilst I did meet the debonair Thomas Brack, who capably runs this outpost, unfortunately, the proprietor, Bart Duykers, was otherwise engaged so I was unable to renew our acquaintance.

I last met Bart 25 years ago, when we were both in the midst of establishing our hospitality careers, neither sure whether they would eventually be deemed a success or not. So, when Bart reached out to me regarding his recently opened outlet in his trio of Ninths, it was with anticipation that I looked forward to meeting up and experiencing this new addition to the fold.

Bart took over The Ninth Floor a number of years ago, followed this a couple of years later, with The Ninth Glass, a more casual bar and bistro in



Surin and now he informed me he had acquired a site in the Boat Lagoon and named it the Ninth Degree.

Arriving for lunch, I am never really sure whether the host will join or leave us to their staff. I am delighted to say that remained. Seated, I observed that our effervescent host looked depressingly not much different from our last meeting, many years ago, whilst I have indeed aged considerably with the inevitable loss of hair and put on weight in all the wrong areas!

At a rustic table overlooking the many monstrous boats moored in the lagoon, the restaurant has been given a much needed makeover, lending it a bright Mediterranean ambience.

Bart orders a number of dishes for us and I see the latest menu includes a tapas platter of sizzling prawns, chorizo



and arancini, a classic croque monsieur, fresh New Zealand oysters and a tempting, antipasti sharing plate. Main courses include a mix of Thai and European dishes; an intriguing khao soi salmon, a signature tom yum risotto, a timeless stroganoff and Mexican nachos with chilli beef, guacamole, sour cream and pico de gallo. Truly an international menu that has something for everyone.

The lunch calls for something pink and our host chooses a stellar example. Over the course of the next few hours we chat incessantly, catching up on the past; enjoying tapas, a 9th Floor recipe of lamb ragout, gently braised, low and slow with a sprinkling of goat cheese, a moreish salmon khao soi and a refreshingly different salad of oranges, fennel, olives and onions.



Bart informs me that business has initially been very positive, which based on the quality of what we have experienced at lunch, I am not surprised. We end on a home-made Belgian waffle and a flourless chocolate cake. Both impeccable.

Time has flown past and I must depart but we won't be waiting a further 25 years for our next catch up as I have a lunch penciled in for my next visit to Phuket. Whilst, the third Ninth is definitely a valued addition to Bart's burgeoning empire, will there be a fourth?







Bayern kings of Europe

Munich worthy winners in strangest Champions League season

It will be remembered as the strangest of Champions League seasons but it has ended with a familiar name on the trophy after Bayern Munich got the better of Paris Saint-Germain in last Sunday's final (Aug 23) in Lisbon, with their deserved success the result of the remarkable job done by coach Hansi Flick.

There was tickertape at the trophy ceremony and the usual celebratory songs playing over the loudspeakers at the Estadio da Luz as the Bayern players savoured the moment after Kingsley Coman's goal saw them defeat PSG 1-0.

But it was a bizarre spectacle with the 65,000-seat stadium empty, supporters having been barred from attending the biggest match in club football.

The coronavirus pandemic killed the Champions League as we know it, at least temporarily, and UEFA was forced to come up with a new 'Final Eight' format in order to make sure its flagship competition was completed.

UEFA president Aleksander



Ceferin told *AFP* in an interview in Lisbon that the format was likely to be a one-off, and some will be tempted to say that this Champions League should always have an asterisk next to it.

But, against first-time finalists PSG, Bayern were worthy winners of their sixth European Cup, their third in the Champions League era.

They won all their 11 Champions

League matches this season, an unprecedented feat, scoring 43 goals on a run that included a 7-2 win at Tottenham Hotspur and the stunning 8-2 demolition of Barcelona in the quarter-finals in Lisbon.

They just had the better of the final, even if they were fortunate at times up against the French side's formidable attack of Neymar, Kylian Mbappe and Angel Di Maria.

'New faces'

In Manuel Neuer, Jerome Boateng, David Alaba and Thomas Mueller, Bayern's line-up featured four survivors from their last final victory, against Borussia Dortmund in 2013.

But this was also about the new faces, such as 19-year-old left-back Alphonso Davies, the Canadian international.

"Moments like these you dream of as a kid," he told DAZN.

Flick deserves great credit. A year ago Bayern were dumped out by Liverpool, the eventual winners, in the last 16, and under Niko Kovac looked a long way off being contenders to win the trophy again.

But Flick replaced Kovac in November, initially as caretaker, and has gone on to win a treble.

Bayern will be a formidable force again next season, which is just around the corner as the Bundesliga starts on Sept 18 and the Champions League group stage in October.

As long as the health crisis does not worsen again, the Champions League will return to normal in the new campaign, and that includes seeing at least some fans return to stadiums.

Istanbul is in line to host the 2021 final, having had this season's showpiece taken away, and hopefully the winning team will be able to celebrate with their supporters.

As Flick said: "It's a pity that the fans couldn't be here with us today. Perhaps they can be back again in the future. A game like this without supporters is not the football that we know."

Boxing coach Fontanills quits

JUAN FONTANILLS SAYS he has quit as coach of the national team because top officials at the Thailand Boxing Association (TBA) intervened in his job.

According to Thai media reports on Monday (Aug 24), the Cuban coach said that he was not happy with some TBA bosses.

Fontanills said he was assigned by the TBA to look after the men's, women's and junior teams and that he knew

his boxers better than anyone else but was never given a free hand.

"Certain TBA executives

intervened in my job so much that I was not happy and decided to return to Mexico," he was quoted as saying.

Fontanills first arrived in Thailand in the 1990s and guided three Thai boxers to win Olympic gold medals – Somluck Kamsing (1996), Wijarn Ponlid (2000) and Manus Boonjumnong (2004) – among other achievements.

He returned for a second stint in the Kingdom in 2018 and under his tutorship several Thai boxers have already secured tickets to next year's Tokyo Olympics. *Bangkok Post*

huket Yacht Club has confirmed it will proudly have at least seven Youth Sailors competing in the Thai National Dinghy Sailing Championships running from the 24th to the 27th of September.

Endorsed by the Yacht Racing Association of Thailand, the regatta will be held in the clear, naval waters of Sattahip in Chon Buri Province, Thailand, and include most of the Kingdom's top-ranked sailors.

Over 100 sailors will be participat-

ing in 10 different classes, including the high-performance O'pen Skiff, the PYC's chosen youth sail-training platform.

"The club is very proud to see these home-grown sailors competing in their first ever major regatta," PYC's Commodore Scott Duncanson told The Phuket News.

"Three of these young sailors were supposed to have been in Sardinia, Italy, for the World Championships last month but unfortunately the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent travel restrictions put a stop to that," he added.

"Although initially very disappointed, the World's have now been rescheduled to July 2021 so we view the Thai National Championship Regatta as a perfect stepping stone for these young sailors towards international-level competition."

The PYC's youth sail-training program has gone from strength to strength in 2020 operating at or near capacity every weekend. The school summer holiday sailing program has been an enormous success with six courses varying from beginners to intermediates being held over the past seven weeks.

The program welcomes children from the ages of 7 to 16 with swimming being the only pre-requisite skill required. What is very encouraging

is that nearly 100 children have now visited the club and taken the opportunity to get themselves on the water and try sailing.

The PYC's location at Chalong Bay is very safe, shallow and near ideal for learning to sail. It is largely protected from the full force of the northeastly and southwesterly monsoon winds, making sailing all year round possible.

Not letting the kids have all the fun, adult sailing courses were recently introduced and the first threeday dinghy sailing clinic was held in July. This included a short passage sail to Koh Lon and an overnight stay at the Cruiser Island Resort.

Most all of the participants were families and it was fantastic to see them connecting face to face and building relationships through sailing. Hermit crab racing, collecting firewood, a beach bonfire, toasting marshmallows and mostly the simple things in life were very successful in creating lifetime memories and detaching the young ones from their electronic devices for a few days, said Scott.

"They were simply too busy having fun to even ask for them."
